




Dodge County Economic Support 2014 - 2015 Healthcare Caseloads (Unduplicated)




2014 - 2015 Food Share Employment & Training, Child Care Only & New Application Caseloads **Dodge County Economic Support** (Unduplicated)




Economic Support Caseload Totals 2014 - 2015












Total # of Juvenile Justice Cases

2015 Children's Monthly Out-of-Home Placement Costs (# of children / \$\$\$)


