PATROL DIVISION

The men and women of the Patrol Division comprise the most viable members of the Dodge County Sheriff's Department. They provide preventative patrol and conduct preliminary criminal investigations in addition to traffic related issues. The objectives of these dedicated deputies are:

To create and maintain the feeling of security in the county.

To facilitate the safe and orderly movement of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

To reduce the opportunity for the commission of crime by maintaining a highly visible presence.

To identify and apprehend those persons violating all traffic and criminal laws.

The Patrol Division is staffed on a 24-hour basis, 365 days a year including holidays. Examples of the more common types of traffic activities during the year which may have resulted in warnings or citations are as follows:
