Dodge County Board of Supervisors October 18, 2016 – 7:00 p.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The October Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisors Johnson and Nelson who had previously asked to be excused.

The Chairman appointed David Guckenberger to the County Board to represent District Number 11 which was vacant. Chairman Kottke called upon Supervisor Behl to escort Mr. Guckenberger forward to be sworn in by the Clerk. The Clerk administered the Oath of Office to Supervisor Guckenberger and welcomed him to the County Board. A motion was made by Supervisor Behl and seconded by Supervisor Schaefer to confirm the appointment. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby confirming the appointment.

Chairman Kottke then appointed Supervisor Guckenberger to fill vacancies on the Finance and Land Information Committees. Mr. Meagher thanked Chief Mannel and Ms. Nehls and informed the County Board that October is Sudden Cardiac Awareness month and that it is important to provide CPR training in our county and in county employment. Mr. Meagher hopes that the County Board will help him

County Project and Issue Update Volume 23 November 2016

<u>Update – Proposed Glacial Heritage Development Partnership (GHDP)</u>: On October 26th, Assistant Corporation Counsel Kathilynne Grotelueschen and I met with Vicki Pratt, President of GHDP and Jefferson County Administrator Ben Wehmeier. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the framework of a potential agreement for a regional approach to economic development assistance. The discussion led to a working draft document which was presented the Executive Committee on November 7th for input and direction.

The initial working draft evolved from an Intergovernmental Agreement to a Contract for Service. The proposal would provide economic development services to all of Dodge County by the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium (JCEDC). Services would be performed by Jefferson County staff. The staff would include, the Executive Director; a full-time Business Development Professional and marketing personnel. Under the proposed arrangement, the staff would be considered Jefferson County employees. The positions are assigned to the JCEDC. Dodge County expenses would be capped at \$85,000 annually with a minimum expense of \$60,000. Quarterly reports would be provided to the Executive Committee in addition to an annual report to the Dodge County Board of Supervisors.

Members of the Executive Committee expressed concern related to a Contract for Service versus an Intergovernmental Agreement. Their preference is an Intergovernmental Agreement. A second issue is with the governance structure. There was a strong consensus by the Executive Committee to have Dodge County representation (combination of public / private sector) as members of the GHDP Board of Directors.

I have conveyed the Executive Committee feedback and direction to Administrator Wehmeier and GHDP President Pratt. A follow-up meeting will be held to review and discuss. The goal is to bring back an updated working draft to the Executive Committee on December 5th. Looking ahead, based on Executive Committee direction, I am anticipating a proposal for full county board discussion in early 2017. Subject to county board approval a best case scenario subject is to have start up by the end of first quarter 2017. As noted in prior communication, a proposed Agreement would be distributed to the full county board well in advance of a scheduled presentation and vote.

Detention Facility Sanitary / Vent Pipe Replacement Project: A project kick-off meeting involving Maas Brothers construction; Engberg Anderson (architect) and the Dodge County team was held Friday, November 4th. The next project meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 6th. As of this writing, the project start date is scheduled for Monday, January 23, 2017.

<u>Neosho – Satellite Highway Shop</u>: Maas Brothers, project construction manager has officially presented Dodge County with a certificate of occupancy for the Neosho satellite highway shop. The majority of the equipment has been transferred to the new shop. A binder coat of asphalt has been paved, the surface coat will be completed in 2017.

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





ORDINANCE NO. 965

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.015 OF THE DODGE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, PROSECUTION OF IN PERSONAM ACTIONS FOR DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAXES AND OTHER CHARGES

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 462, An Ordinance Authorizing the Commencement and Prosecution of In Personam Actions for Delinquent Real Estate Taxes and Other Charges, was enacted by the Dodge County Board of Supervisors on January 20, 1998; and,

WHEREAS, subsequent to the enactment of Ordinance No. 462, Ordinance No. 462 was codified as Section 3.015 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances (Code of Ordinances); and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Taxation Committee recommends that Section 3.015 be amended;

SO, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF DODGE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 3.015 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

- "(1) This section is adopted pursuant to the authority provided under § 74.53(5), Wis. Stats.
- The Corporation Counsel for Dodge County, upon request of the Dodge County Treasurer Taxation Committee, is hereby authorized to commence and prosecute an action to recover real property taxes and costs against persons pursuant to § 74.53, Wis. Stats., for any of the following amounts that are included in the tax rolls for collection and any of the amounts under subparagraphs (b) and (c) that are not included in the tax roll for collection:
 - (a) Delinquent real property taxes, special charges, special assessments and special taxes, not including amounts under subparagraphs (b) and (c), that were delinquent during the period that the person owned the property if the property against which the amounts are levied was included in a tax certificate issued under § 74.57, Wis. Stats.;
 - (b) The cost of razing and removing property and restoring the site to a dust-free and erosion free condition incurred under § 66.05(2), (5), (8)(bg) or (10) 66.0413(1)(br)2., (f), (g) or (i), (2)(d) or (4), Wis. Stats., or of filling an excavation incurred under § 66.05(6) 66.0427, Wis. Stats., if the person owned the property when the property was razed and removed and the site restored or the excavation was filled, or if the person owned the property

while the order to raze the property was recorded in the register of deeds office;

- (c) The cost of abating a public nuisance under § 245.595 or 823.04, Wis. Stats., if the person owned the property when the public nuisance was abated.
- (3) Upon commencement of an action as described in subsection (2), above, the Corporation Counsel is authorized to petition the Court to appoint a receiver to take charge of property included in a tax certificate under § 74.57, Wis. Stats. The receiver shall manage the property, collect rents, and apply income to the payment of delinquent real property taxes.
- (4) In accordance with the provisions of § 74.53(5), Wis. Stats., the Dodge County Board of Supervisors waives the duty to specifically approve each in personam action that Dodge County may commence under § 74.53, Wis. Stats., and waives the duty to send notice to each person against whom such actions may be commenced.
- (5) The Dodge County Taxation Committee shall review the Treasurer's records regarding delinquencies and determine, in its discretion, whether to commence an in personam action against the property owner. If, in its discretion, the Taxation Committee decides to take action against the property owner(s), the following procedure shall be followed:
 - (a) The Treasurer shall send written notice to the owner or owners of properties which have been determined appropriate for in personam action, advising the owner that a decision has been made to commence an in personam action against him or her. The notice shall indicate that if full payment of the amounts recoverable under § 74.53, Wis. Stats., including interest and penalties, is received within four (4) weeks from the date of the notice, the in personam action will not be commenced. The notice shall be personally delivered or mailed via registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the owner at his or her last known address.

(b) The Treasurer shall complete an affidavit setting forth the following:

- 1) the names of the owners provided with notice under sub. (a);
- 2) whether the notice was delivered personally or by mail;
- 3) if delivered by mail, the date of mailing and address to which it was mailed; and
- 4) a list of those owners for which no address was found.
- (c) If the owner fails to make full and timely payment as requested in the notice, Corporation Counsel may commence the in personam action.

- (6) In the event a judgment is granted in an in personam action brought under sub. (5), the Corporation Counsel for Dodge County is further authorized to take all appropriate actions necessary to enforce and collect said judgment.
- (7) Nothing contained herein, nor any use made of the procedure provided herein, shall prevent the use of other procedures provided for in the Dodge County Code of Ordinances or Wisconsin Statutes for the collection of the amounts in sub. (2)(a)-(c)."

Section 2: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon enactment and publication as provided by law.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS.

WHEREAS, the undersigned Committee has determined that the Rules Of Order Governing The County Board Of Supervisors Of Dodge County, WI for the period of time commencing on April 19, 2016, and ending on April 17, 2018, both inclusive, should be the same as those set forth in the Official Directory For Dodge County dated June of 2016, with certain exceptions;

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, effective immediately, the Rules Of Order Governing The County Board Of Supervisors Of Dodge County, WI for the period of time commencing on April 19, 2016, and ending on April 17, 2018, both inclusive, shall be the same as those set forth in the Official Directory For Dodge County dated June of 2016, except that:

1. The paragraph pertaining to the Taxation Committee shall be amended to read as follows:

Taxation Committee

The Taxation Committee shall be comprised of five (5) Board members. The five (5) members shall be appointed by the Chairman and confirmed by the Board. The committee shall: review the Treasurer's records and authorize the prosecution of in personam actions for delinquent real estate taxes and other charges; review foreclosure of tax liens by action in rem; appraise all parcels of real estate acquired by Judgment of Foreclosure Of Tax Lien in in rem actions pursuant to Wis. Stats. §75.521; authorize the publication of a list of appraised values for the purpose of soliciting bids on parcels of real estate to be sold; open all bids and accept or reject them; and, authorize the Dodge County Clerk to issue Ouit Claim Deeds to successful bidders. Pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stats. § 75.69, the Board designates the Taxation Committee as the committee that is authorized to: review and approve the sales of parcels of real estate for amounts that are less than the appraised values of the parcels of real estate; accept bids for the sale of parcels of real estate that are less than the highest bids; and, prepare written statements, available for public inspection, that explain the reasons for accepting bids for the sale of parcels of real estate that are less than the highest bids.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-65

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF INCREASED FUNDING IN THE CHILDREN AND FAMILY AIDS ALLOCATION

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS:

- WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families provides funding to counties through the Children and Family Aids allocation for the provision of child abuse and neglect services, including prevention, investigation, treatment, and out-of-home placement costs; and,
- **WHEREAS**, base funding for child welfare services has not increased since the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families was created in 2009; and,
- WHEREAS, over the past few years, the child welfare workload has increased in all counties across the state; and,
 - WHEREAS, counties are struggling to recruit and retain child welfare workers; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the stress of increasing caseloads is taking its toll on CPS workers, causing many experienced child welfare workers to leave the profession; and,

- WHEREAS, the total number of children in out-of-home care statewide has increased by eight percent since 2011 from 7,653 children in out-of-home care in 2011 to 8,258 children in out-of-home care in 2015; and the total number of children in out-of-home care in Dodge County has increased by 64 percent since January 2014 from 50 children in out-of-home care in January 2014 to 82 children in out-of-home care in September 2016; and,
- WHEREAS, the total number of screened-in CPS reports statewide has increased by nine percent since 2011 from 18,706 screened-in CPS reports in 2011 to 20,384 screened-in CPS reports in 2015; and the total number of screened-in CPS reports in Dodge County has increased by 21% percent since 2012 from 278 screened-in CPS reports in 2012 to 337 screened-in CPS reports in 2015; and,
- WHEREAS, the total number of Children in Need of Protection and Services (CHIPS) petitions filed with the court statewide has increased 12.5 percent from 2008 to 2015; and the total number of CHIPS petitions filed with the court in Dodge County has increased by 38% since 2012 from 47 CHIPS petitions filed with the court in 2012 to 65 CHIPS petitions filed with the court in 2015; and,
- WHEREAS, the leading cause of these increases is the use of heroin, opiates, and methamphetamines; and,

WHEREAS, it is critical that counties have the resources necessary to ensure the safety of children in all areas of the state; and,

WHEREAS, counties are struggling to identify resources to increase child welfare staff, especially given the significant overmatch counties already put into the human services system;

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors does hereby request that the state of Wisconsin, in its 2017-2019 state biennial budget, increase funding to counties in the Children and Family Aids allocation to assist counties in serving the increasing number of children and families in the child welfare system; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, all Wisconsin State Legislators with a constituency within Dodge County, and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

Re: Explanation of request for additional funds for NetSmart software project

On August 18, 2015, the County Board of Supervisors approved Resolution 15-29, providing the approval and funding to purchase the NetSmart MyEvolv software for the Human Services and Health department. This system is to take the place of the current TCM (The Clinical Manager) software as it was not HIPAA compliant or Meaningful Use capable.

Order Connect / CareConnect, a third party product, was purchased as a part of the NetSmart MyEvolv project to provide a subscription service to fulfill Meaningful Use data for Medicare. At the time of training it was noted by the Order Connect implementer that a portion of what was needed to be turned on for successful delivery of lab test results, was left off. It was discovered that Dodge County had not actually purchased that portion of the product, and it will, therefore, require an additional purchase by Dodge, to get that portion of the product that will allow laboratory test results to be returned electronically to the system. It appears that what Dodge purchased was the capability to manage prescriptions and to send lab test results out. The other discovery is the lack of system support to the Public Health department. The needs of the Public Health professionals in Human Services and Health are better served with the tools available in CareConnect.

The resolution before you is a request for the additional cost to add the following features to the CareConnect product in order to ensure the solution is in-line with Meaningful Use requirements for transitions of care.

CareConnect Labs

CareConnect Labs empowers clients to electronically exchange lab orders/results seamlessly through their CareRecord.

• CareConnect Syndromic Surveillance

Surveillance electronically submits syndromic surveillance data to public health agencies in realtime which enables the tracking of chief presenting complaints from emergent care settings, allowing public health officials and providers to rapidly detect unusual outbreaks of illness.

CareConnect Immunization

CareConnect Immunization connects to state immunization registries via a secure, HIPAA-compliant HL7 interface in states that authorize those connections, and to several other state

immunization registries via state-specific connections. This connection enables facilities to manage vaccine supplies, assist in pandemic flu and emergency preparedness, and support links to other existing child health databases.

• CareConnect Direct Messaging

CareConnect Direct Messaging enables care providers to communicate with a client's entire care team (in and outside of the agency) in a direct, secure and confidential exchange. This solution is in-line with Meaningful Use Stage 2 requirements of transitions of care.

An Ordinance amending the Shoreland Protection Ordinance, Dodge County, Wisconsin.

Whereas the subject matter of this Ordinance has been duly referred to and considered by the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee and a public hearing having been held, after the giving of requisite notice of said hearing and a recommendation thereon having been reported to the Board of Supervisors, Dodge County, Wisconsin as required by Section 59.69 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
