

Dodge County Board of Supervisors December 20, 2016 – 7:00 p.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The December Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisor Berres who had previously asked to be excused.

Chairman Kottke then called for approval of the minutes. A motion was made by Supervisor Maly and seconded by Supervisor Schmidt to approve the minutes of the November 15, 2016, session of the County Board meeting as recorded, and dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

Communications on File

Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, read a thank you letter, addressed to Dodge County from the Lein family, regarding the safe return of their son on July 10, 2016. Ms. Gibson also read a letter from Chester Caine thanking the County Board of Supervisors, Chairman Kottke and Administrator James Mielke for his appointment to the Veterans Service Commission. The Chairman ordered these be placed on file.

Special Orders of Business

The Chairman called the First Special Order of Business: Elections. Supervisor Derr nominated Donna Birschbach to the Civil Service Commission for a four year term commencing on January 1, 2017 to January 1, 2021, both inclusive. The nomination was seconded by Supervisor Nelson. Supervisor Behl moved nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Donna Birschbach. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Schaefer with no objections, thereby re-electing Donna Birschbach to the Civil Service Commission with a term to expire on January 1, 2021.

Mr. Mielke then appointed Jeffrey Caine to the Monarch Library System Board of Trustees for a two-year term, commencing on January 1, 2017, to December 31, 2018, both inclusive. A motion to accept the appointment was made by Supervisor Bischoff and seconded by Supervisor Guckenberger. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointment.

Mr. Mielke then appointed Mark Hanson to the Monarch Library System Board of Trustees for a three-year term, commencing on January 1, 2017, to December 31, 2019, both inclusive. A motion to accept the appointment was made by Supervisor Caine and seconded by Supervisor Miller. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointment.

Reappoint Daniel Klossner, Roger Gorst, Harold Zastrow, Mary Ann Miller and Kristin Fabisch as members of the Board of Directors on the Friends of Clearview Committee for two year terms commencing on December 31, 2016 to December 31, 2018, both inclusive. A motion to accept the appointments was made by Supervisor Nickel and seconded by Supervisor Greshay. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointments.

Chairman Kottke called upon Marie Witzel, 4-H/Youth Development Educator who named the 2016 4-H Key Award winners: Madeline McGauley, Emma Meyer, Dylon Pokorny and Nicole Wenzel. Madeline McGauley, Emma Meyer and Dylon Pokorny addressed the County Board of Supervisors, telling them about their many 4-H experiences and also thanking the board and citizens of Dodge County for their support of the 4-H program. County Clerk Gibson read a letter on behalf of award recipient Nicole Wenzel who was unable to attend. Chairman Kottke congratulated the recipients and presented the 4-H Key Award to them as well as a proclamation from the State of Wisconsin.

Resolution No. 16-70 Authority to Purchase Three 60,000 LB. GVW Tandem Dump Truck Chassis – Highway Committee. A motion for adoption was made by Supervisor Muche and seconded by Supervisor Johnson. Question by Supervisor Houchin answered by Supervisor Johnson, Chairman Kottke and Brian Field, Highway Commissioner. The vote was cast with all voting in the affirmative, thereby adopting the Resolution.

<u>Resolution No. 16-71</u> Appropriate Excess Revenues and Expenditures in the Human Services and Health Department Budget – Human Services and Health Board. A motion for adoption was made by Supervisor Justmann and seconded by Supervisor Duchac. Comment by Supervisor Derr. The vote was cast with all voting in the affirmative, thereby adopting the Resolution.

Claim No. 1 A claim by Maxine E. Paxson for money damages in the amount of \$1,610.11, for costs to repair a 2002 American Eagle motor home (motor home), and for money damages in an unspecified, unknown amount, for costs to repair damage to a shower stall in the motor home, was received in the Office of the Dodge County Clerk on October 3, 2016. The claim arises from an incident which is alleged to have occurred on August 1, 2016, at or about 10:00 a.m., wherein William Paxson was operating the motor home, at a speed of approximately 50 miles per hour, on CTH T, at or near N2483 CTH T, in the Town of Portland, Dodge County, Wisconsin, when the motor home traveled over an unpaved, gravel-surfaced depression in CTH T, located on a part of CTH T, under and across which the Dodge County Highway Department had recently installed a new culvert, thereby causing damage to the motor home. Maxine E. Paxson further alleges that it will cost \$1,610.11 to 1) repair a bed slide out attachment, 2) repair a living room slide out, 3) remove and replace a slide room front awning which was damaged, and, 4) remove and replace a slide room rear awning to match the slide room front awning which was damaged, and, that, in addition, it will cost an unspecified, unknown amount of money to repair damage to a shower stall in the motor home. The Clerk read a report from the Executive Committee recommending the claim be disallowed. A motion to approve the disallowance was made by Supervisor Schmidt and seconded by Supervisor Maly. The vote was cast with all voting in the affirmative, thereby disallowing the claim.

Claim No. 2 A claim by Alcus T. Thompson (Mr. Thompson) for money damages in the amount of \$4,603.80, for costs to repair the exterior of a 2004 Chevrolet Avalanche pickup truck (truck), was received in the Office of the Dodge County Clerk on November 16, 2016. The claim arises from an incident which is alleged to have occurred on September 29, 2016, at or about 12:30-1:30 p.m., wherein Mr. Thompson was operating the truck on CTH Z, at or near N2639 CTH Z, in the Town of Sullivan, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, in the same area in which, and after the time at which, a truck owned and operated by the Dodge County Highway Department was used to paint striping on CTH Z, when paint that had been sprayed onto the surface of CTH Z was transferred onto the exterior of the truck. Mr. Thompson submitted an estimate showing that it will cost \$4,603.80 to repair the damage to the exterior of the truck caused by the paint. Mr. Thompson included a written Description of Incident/Loss, which states as follow: "Road paint was wet + there were no visible signs that it had just been sprayed. Paint got in the wheel well + along the bottom of the vehicle (fender, front door, rear door, quarter panel, tailgate, rear bumper + rear suspension)." The Clerk read a report from the Executive Committee recommending the claim be disallowed. A motion to approve the disallowance was made by Supervisor Maly and seconded by Supervisor Marsik. The vote was cast with all voting in the affirmative, thereby disallowing the claim.

The Clerk noted the following had been placed on the Supervisor's desks: 2017 Land Atlas and Platbook. The Chairman ordered this be placed on file.

At 7:47 p.m. Supervisor Frohling made a motion to recess until February 22, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. Supervisor Maly seconded the motion. The motion passed by acclamation, with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

County Project and Issue Update Volume 25 February 2017

<u>2017-19 Wisconsin Biennial Budget</u>: With the introduction of the 2017-19 budget by Governor Walker, the Wisconsin Counties Association Government Affairs team has provided a 15 page initial summary document outlining impacts to county programs and services.

A copy of the WCA budget summary dated February 8th is available for viewing on the Dodge County website. The document is located on both the County Board and Finance Department tabs. The goal is to provide timely information related to the State Budget to you and the public. The WCA budget summary was distributed to Dodge County Department Heads on Wednesday morning February 9th. Additional information related to the State budget will be added to the two website locations as it becomes available.

<u>Health Insurance Update</u>: The Wisconsin Department of Employee Trust Funds, Group Insurance Board met on February 8th. As anticipated, the Board approved the intent to transition provider contracts to self-insurance effective January 1, 2018. As you are aware, Dodge County participates in the State Health Insurance Program. The Human Resource Department / Administration and Human Resource & Labor Negotiation Committee has been monitoring the Board action and potential impacts to Dodge County as an employer and to employees.

The ETF Board issued a memo dated February 9th to the Co-Chairs on the Joint Committee on Finance. The seven page memo provides a good summary of the action taken by the Board and outlines next steps in the process. A copy of the February 9th has been distributed to Dodge County Department Heads and has been posted on the Dodge County website, under the Human Resource Department tab. It is located under the Benefits sub-heading. The intent is provide easy access for all county employees to view information related to the proposed transition to self-insurance. Please note, the proposed providers for the southern region which includes Dodge County are Dean Care and Unity. Dean and Unity are the two current providers of health coverage to a vast majority of current county employees. Additional information will be provided as it becomes available.

<u>Update – Highway Department Supervisory Vehicles</u>: The Dodge County Highway Committee has adopted a written policy related to the five take home county issued vehicles. (Highway Commissioner/ Assistant Commissioner/ Operations Superintendent / East Side and West Side Superintendent). The draft policy was distributed to the Committee on January 12th for their review. Formal action adopting the Department policy was taken by the Highway Committee on February 2nd.

February 8th Non-Point Run Off / Healthy Lakes Seminar: Approximately 260 individuals were in attendance at the Juneau Community Center on February 8th for the all-day event to hear information about best practices related to non-point run off and water quality. In the evening a presentation related to healthy lakes was held in the Administration Building. The full day and evening event was a combined effort of the agricultural community and lakes community which provided an opportunity to learn from each other. The Dodge County Land Conservation staff and Land Conservation Committee were active participants and planners of the event. Congratulations to all involved for a successful, informative day!

<u>Background</u>: February 2015, discussion between Dodge / Jefferson County representatives regarding regional collaboration and potential opportunities for partnerships.

Prior to February 2015, there had been informal discussions regarding a regional approach to economic development initiatives and collaboration opportunities with City of Beaver Dam; Washington County and Fond du Lac County. TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS,

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium (hereinafter the "JCEDC") was formed in 2003 and consists of the following member communities: Jefferson County, Cambridge, Fort Atkinson, Jefferson, Johnson Creek, Lake Mills, Waterloo, Watertown, and Whitewater; and,

WHEREAS, the JCEDC serves as the lead economic development organization in the Jefferson County area and was formed to achieve the economic development goals of the area; and,

WHEREAS, the JCEDC has created a new public-private nonprofit organization, Glacial Heritage Development Partnership (hereinafter "GHDP"), to lead and coordinate the area's strategic efforts in economic development; and,

WHEREAS, GHDP will contract with the JCEDC for staff to manage implementation of GHDP's 5-year plan, the 2017-2022 Strategic Plan, throughout the region; and,

Partnership Agreement Between Dodge County, the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium, and Glacial Heritage Development Partnership

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made by and between the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium (the "JCEDC"), Glacial Heritage Development Partnership ("GHDP"), and Dodge County, Wisconsin (the "County").

WHEREAS, the JCEDC was formed in 2003 and consists of the following member communities: Jefferson County, Cambridge, Fort Atkinson, Jefferson, Johnson Creek, Lake Mills, Waterloo, Watertown, and Whitewater; and,

WHEREAS, the JCEDC serves as the lead economic development organization in the Jefferson County area and was formed to achieve the economic development goals of the area; and,

WHEREAS, the JCEDC has created a new public-private nonprofit organization, GHDP, to lead and coordinate the area's strategic efforts in economic development; and,

WHEREAS, GHDP will contract with the JCEDC for staff to manage implementation of GHDP's 5-year plan, the 2017-2022 Strategic Plan, throughout the region; and,

WHEREAS, the 2017-2022 Strategic Plan has four distinct areas of focus:

- 1. Business: Grow Businesses, Capital Investment and Employment Opportunities;
- 2. Workforce: Attract, Develop, and Align Talent;
- 3. Build Capacity: Grow the GHDP's capacity to execute professional economic development programs and services;
- 4. Marketing: Raise awareness of the area's assets to attract business investment, talent, and visitors with discretionary dollars.

WHEREAS, In order to implement these goals GHDP intends to secure funding via a capital campaign; and,

WHEREAS, the County desires to promote economic development throughout Dodge County; and,

WHEREAS, the County, the JCEDC, and GHDP, recognize the benefits of taking a regional approach to economic development; and,

WHEREAS, GHDP is willing to provide economic development services and expand the scope of the 2017-2022 Strategic Plan to include Dodge County; and,

WHEREAS, entering into this Agreement with the JCEDC and GHDP will supplement the County's existing work on economic development;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the JCEDC, GHDP, and the County, as follows:

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The parties desire to work together to coordinate and advance economic development throughout the Jefferson and Dodge County region.
- 2. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement shall become effective on the date of last signature below, but no later than March 31, 2017, and shall continue through December 31, 2021, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 herein.
- 3. Payment. The County shall pay to the JCEDC a lump sum of \$85,000 annually from 2017 through 2021. The first payment shall be made within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Agreement, with annual payments to be made on or before March 31st, each year thereafter. Payment shall be sent to: 864 Collins Road, Jefferson, WI 53549

The funds paid by the County under this Section shall be limited to use by the JCEDC to carry out activities and programming in Dodge County, as directed by GHDP.

4. Obligations of the JCEDC.

- A. The JCEDC staff members, under contract with and at the direction of GHDP, shall provide economic development services to all of Dodge County. Services provided shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - i. Business Retention and Expansion visits. Professional economic development staff will conduct targeted visits with up to 30 of Dodge County's primary employers in year one to ascertain barriers to growth and identify key local assets utilized by employers. Said visits shall assist the JCEDC staff in forming an economic development plan for the work to be completed in Dodge County during years two through five of this Agreement.
 - ii. Direct Expansion Assistance. Provide professional, timely and appropriate assistance to businesses considering new capital investments in Dodge County.
 - iii. Coordinate with regional entities to provide marketing and outreach that supports new business investments in Dodge County.
 - iv. Work with Dodge County Planning and others to compile an asset inventory of sites, buildings, and other resources that are in place to support business growth within Dodge County, and identify gaps that would serve as the basis for future asset development work.
 - v. Promote Dodge County's business assets on the GHDP Website and in outreach and marketing materials.
 - vi. Assist with the development of marketing materials for business attraction to Dodge County.

- vii. Assist and coordinate with development of a Prospect Identification process designed to identify businesses in targeted industry sectors in Dodge County.
- viii. Work with Dodge County Planning to ensure accurate demographic data, and information on available sites and buildings, are current and that all pertinent data is posted on appropriate websites.
- ix. Talent Attraction. Assist and coordinate in the development and implementation of a marketing strategy designed to attract workers to Dodge County.
- B. The JCEDC staff, under contract with GHDP, within one (1) year from the execution of this Agreement, shall prepare and present a report to the County and GHDP containing the issues and needs identified in Dodge County and the recommended actions to address those issues and needs.

5. Obligations of GHDP.

- A. GHDP, in its bylaws, shall provide that the County has one permanent seat on the GHDP Board of Directors. The chair of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors shall annually appoint one (1) individual, and one (1) alternate, to fill the seat on the GHDP Board of Directors.
- B. GHDP shall, within fourteen (14) months of execution of this Agreement, amend its 2017-2022 Strategic Plan to incorporate provisions of the report created by the JCEDC staff under Section 4.B., to address the issues and needs identified, in order to establish a regional approach to economic development.
- C. GHDP shall work with the Executive Committee of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors and business leaders, on an annual basis, to determine which specific services will be provided to the County and which areas of concern the County desires to focus on, within the framework of services performed by JCEDC.
 - i. This shall be discussed at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Executive Committee, with the first discussion to take place in September 2017.

6. Obligations of the County.

- A. The County shall work cooperatively with GHDP and the JCEDC staff in arranging and coordinating meetings with local businesses and professionals, including finding locations and setting up for the meetings.
- B. The County shall provide an office space, as an in kind donation, for the JCEDC staff to utilize while providing services in Dodge County.
 - The office shall be located in the Land Resources and Parks Department on the 3rd
 Floor of the Dodge County Administration Building, 127 E. Oak Street, Juneau,
 WI 53039.

ii. The JCEDC staff shall be responsible for having his or her own computer, or other electronic device, and telephone.

7. Reports.

- A. GHDP shall provide semi-annual reports to the Dodge County Administrator, the Chair of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors, and the Dodge County Executive Committee regarding GHDP's activities that period, including aggregate data, and anticipated action for the upcoming period.
 - i. GHDP shall prepare such reports and cause them to be received by County not later than the 5th day of the month that is six (6) months from the date this Agreement is executed; and on a semi-annual basis, thereafter.
 - ii. Reports shall set forth a detailed description of the economic development services that GHDP provided to the County including aggregate reports on existing business visits; on expansion assistance requests; on actions taken to address barriers and opportunities identified, and on progress towards building and then promoting business-related assets.
- B. GHDP shall provide annual written and oral reports to the Dodge County Board of Supervisors each September, commencing September 2017.
- 8. <u>Independent Contractors</u>. It is mutually agreed and understood that the JCEDC staff members, including those providing specific services to the County, are at all times acting and performing as independent contractors. Nothing is this Agreement shall be construed to create an employer-employee relationship between the JCEDC staff members and the County.
- 9. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon six (6) months written notice to the non-terminating party.
- 10. <u>Severability</u>. The terms of this Agreement are severable and any determination by any court or agency having jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Agreement that results in the invalidity of any part shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement.
- 11. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be revised, modified, or amended only upon written agreement of the Parties. All modifications, amendments, or alterations shall be set forth in writing and made a part of this Agreement by incorporated reference.
- 12. Governing Law & Forum. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wisconsin. Venue as to any dispute that may arise under this Agreement shall be in the Circuit Court of Dodge County, Wisconsin.
- 13. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

- 14. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. Any and all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations and understandings of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement, oral or written, are superseded by this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Assignment</u>. The parties agree that there shall be no assignment or transfer of this Agreement, nor any interests, rights or responsibilities contained herein, except as agreed to in writing.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, GHDP, the JCEDC, and the County certify that this Agreement has been duly approved by their respective governing bodies in accordance with State and local laws, rules, and regulations, and each has caused their duly authorized officers to execute this Agreement on the dates indicated below.

Re: Maas Brothers Construction Incorporated Request for Allocation of 179 D Energy Efficient Commercial Building Deduction – Henry Dodge Renovation Project

Background: IRS Tax Code 179D provides "for profit" entities to file for a tax credit regarding energy efficient design / engineering of commercial buildings. Maas Brothers has enlisted the services of their business accounting firm (Wipfli – pronounced WIP-fle) and the consulting firm of Walker Reid Strategies to assist in determining whether the renovation of the Henry Dodge Office Building would qualify Maas Brothers Construction Incorporated for the tax deduction.

The Henry Dodge Office Building was officially placed into service in November 2013. In conversation with Anthony Maas he indicated there is a three year look back provision which would enable the tax deduction to be available through the filing of a 2016 tax return. Anthony stated Maas Brothers recently became aware of the potential deduction through Wipfli.

Bray Associates Architects was selected by Dodge County as the lead designer of the Henry Dodge Renovation Project. Maas Brothers performed as Construction Manager and also self-performed various phases of the renovation project. I spoke with Matt Wolfert, Principal in Charge from Bray Associates regarding the 179D allocation. Mr. Wolfert informed me that Bray Associates has utilized the 179D Allocation on other projects, however they are not seeking a 179D allocation for the Henry Dodge Project. The decision is based on the overall size of the renovation project.

The allocation request from Maas Brothers and support documents have been reviewed by John Corey; Kathilynne Grotelueschen. In addition, Dodge County initiated contact with representatives of Baker Tilly and Johnson Block for additional information. In conversation with Baker Tilly representatives, Dodge County learned that typically the request for the 179D tax deduction allocation is negotiated /completed at the front end of a project. According to Baker Tilly, the 179D Code was implemented in 2005 as an incentive for governments to design / construct energy efficient buildings. According to Baker Tilly, IRS Code 179D is currently scheduled to expire at the end of 2016 and that Federal legislation is pending to extend the tax deduction.

The Dodge County Executive Committee reviewed the request at their January 3rd meeting. The Committee is recommending approval of the Maas Brothers request. Additional information regarding the 179 D program is attached along with the allocation application.

Henry Dodge Building - Maas Brothers Request for Part 179D Tax Deduction Allocation

Introduction

Rather than tax code, 179D is part of The Energy Policy Act of 2005 which creates financial incentive to invest in energy-efficient building systems. In practice, the advantages of the tax deduction are often available to whichever project entity that meets the Act's qualifications and acts to obtain them.

How does Maas meet the definition of a designer?

A designer may include an architect, engineer, contractor, environmental consultant or energy services provider. An entity that merely installs, repairs, or maintain the property is not a designer. By providing Construction Manager services that included value engineering (alterations in design) items as well as third party design review of the project's Electrical and HVAC systems, Maas Brothers meets the definition of designer under 179D.

What support can Maas provide that it can claim 100% of the allocation?

179D allocations are based on three design criteria, HVAC, lighting, and building envelop. If each of those components was included as part of the qualifying project, the entity receiving the allocation may be allocated 100% of the deduction, regardless of whether they had direct influence on each component.

On what basis did Walker Reid come to conclusion that the building qualifies?

The improvements made to the Dodge County have clearly exceeded the requirements set forth by the IRS and Department of Energy. After its in-depth review Walker Reid determined the lighting improvements are 41% more efficient then the baseline requirements, the HVAC systems are 20% more efficient and the envelope improvements appear to be approximately 10-15% more efficient. The combination should yield a result once modeled that is well above the IRS required 50% reduction against the ASHRAE baseline.



About 179D





About Section 179D Tax Deduction

Section 179D of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) is an engineered based tax incentive available for the reduction of energy and power costs in commercial buildings. The tax provision was initially enacted under the 2005 Energy Policy Act (EPACT) and allows for a tax deduction of up to \$1.80 per square foot. The 179D Tax Deduction specifically applies to those commercial buildings that notably reduce their interior lighting energy costs, as well as heating, cooling, and building envelope. Buildings can partially qualify for \$0.60 for HVAC, \$0.60 for building envelope, and \$0.60 for Lighting systems.

Qualifying Requirements

Section 179D requires for the taxpayers building to meet or exceed a 50% savings in energy and power costs when compared to a theoretical ASHRAE 90.1-2001 baseline building. If the target of 50% savings

is met, the building will qualify for \$1.80/SF (capped at the costs of the capitalized improvements).

For buildings which do not meet the 50% savings, the tax provision also allows for partially qualifying systems.

- \$0.60/SF for HVAC systems meeting 15% savings
- \$0.60/SF for Lighting systems meeting
 25% savings
- \$0.60/SF for Building Envelope systems meeting 10% savings

Additionally, the Interim Lighting Rule allows for lighting systems to qualify for 30¢-60¢per square foot for a 25% -40% savings in Lighting Power Density (LPD) compared to ASHRAE 90.1-2001 LPD standards.

Certification Requirements

- The energy and power costs savings calculations must be performed with a <u>Dept. of Energy</u> approved software.
- Field inspections must be performed after the energy efficient property has been placed into service in accordance with <u>NREL Guidelines</u>
- Certifications and inspections must be completed by a qualified Engineer or Contractor in the Jurisdiction of the qualifying building.

 The taxpayer shall maintain the certification in their records to establish the entitlement to, and amount of, the deduction claimed.

Government Owned Buildings

Governments are non-taxable entities and are unable to benefit from the section 179D tax incentive. Because of this, the IRS established guidance in 2008 allowing governments to allocate the deduction to the parties involved in the design of the energy efficient systems. In addition to the certification, the taxpayers receiving an allocated deduction must retain an "Allocation Letter" in their records.



Allocation Letter



On April 7, 2008 the IRS published <u>Notice 2008-40</u> providing guidance for the Allocation of the deduction to designers/contractors. The primary points addressed in the allocation are:

- Verifying the parties involvement in the project
- Cost of property installed
- The year the property was placed into service
- The amount of the 179D deduction being allocated

Time Frame

For Commercial Building Owners, the section 179D deduction may be claimed for new construction or improvements placed into service between January 1, 2006, and December 31, 2016. Form 3115, Change in Accounting Method, may be used to retroactively take

the deduction in current year tax filings and avoid amending previous year returns.

The designers/contractors of government owned buildings are able to take the 179D deduction for all "open tax years" (generally 3 years from date of filing). For property placed into service in previous years, the taxpayers are required to amend their returns.

Would You Benefit From 179D?

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TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS,

WHEREAS, Section 179D of the Energy Policy Act of 2005 created the Energy Efficient Commercial Building Tax Deduction (hereinafter, "Section 179D Tax Deduction"), which allows up to \$1.80 per square foot in deductions to owners of energy efficient commercial properties or architects, engineers, and designers of energy efficient government building projects; and,

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2012, Dodge County entered into a contract with Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc., for the renovation of the former Clearview North Long Term Care Building located at 199 Home Road in the City of Juneau, Wisconsin (hereinafter, the "Contract"); and,

WHEREAS, Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc., was the Construction Manager under the Contract; and,

WHEREAS, Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc. has been advised by its accounting firm, WIPFLi, and its consultant, Walker Reid, that it would be eligible for a Section 179D Tax Deduction based upon the work performed for Dodge County under the Contract if Dodge County allocates its deduction to Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc. has requested that Dodge County sign the Allocation of §179 Energy Efficient Commercial Building Deduction, attached as "Exhibit A," and allocate 100% of its Section 179D Tax Deduction for work performed under the Contract to Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Administrator has consulted with Johnson Block, Dodge County's Accounting Firm, and has been advised that an allocation of Dodge County's Section 179D Tax Deduction for work performed under the Contract will have no financial impact on Dodge County; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Executive Committee has considered Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc.'s request and has determined that allocating Dodge County's Section 179D Tax Deduction for qualifying work, to qualifying companies, will aid in negotiation of, and provide companies with a greater incentive to submit bids for, future public construction projects in Dodge County; and,

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee recommends that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorize and direct the Dodge County Administrator to sign the Allocation of §179 Energy Efficient Commercial Building Deduction, attached as "Exhibit A", allocating 100% of Dodge County's Section 179D Tax Deduction for work performed under the Contract to Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc.

- SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors hereby:
 - 1. Authorizes and directs the Dodge County Administrator to sign the Allocation of §179 Energy Efficient Commercial Building Deduction, attached as "Exhibit A", allocating 100% of Dodge County's Section 179D Tax Deduction for work performed under the Contract to Maas Brothers Construction Company, Inc.

Appointment and Supervision of Corporation Counsel

I have been asked to research whether, under Wisconsin law, a county board of supervisors, in a county having a county administrator, can delegate the authority to appoint and supervise corporation counsel to a committee of the board of supervisors. For the reasons discussed below, it is my opinion that, in a county having a county administrator, the county administrator has the exclusive statutory authority to appoint and supervise corporation counsel and this authority may not be shifted from the county administrator to a committee of the county board.

Wisconsin counties are legislative creatures and, as such, have only those powers that the legislature has provided by statute. *Jackson County v. State*, 2006 WI 96, ¶ 16, 293 Wis. 2d 497, 717 N.W.2d 713. The powers of a county board are governed by Wis. Stat. § 59.51, which in relevant part, states:

The board of each county shall have the authority to exercise any organizational or administrative power, subject only to the constitution and any enactment of the legislature which grants the organizational or administrative power to a county executive or county administrator or to a person supervised by a county executive or county administrator or any enactment which is of statewide concern and which uniformly affects every county.

WIS. STAT. § 59.51(1) (emphasis added). Thus, a county board's powers are limited to the extent that the legislature grants specific powers to a county executive or county administrator. Further, Wisconsin courts have long held that, "[s]tatutory powers and duties conferred upon a county officer cannot be narrowed, enlarged, or taken away by a county board unless the legislature has authorized such action." Harbick v. Marinette Cty., 138 Wis. 2d 172, 179, 405 N.W.2d 724, 727

(Ct. App. 1987). In counties having a county administrator, the Wisconsin Legislature has expressly conferred the power to appoint and supervise corporation counsel upon the county administrator. Consequently, in such counties, the county board lacks the power to appoint and supervise corporation counsel and cannot remove such power from the county administrator.

The duties and powers of the county administrator are found in Wis. Stat. § 59.18(2). That section states, in part, that the duties and powers of the county administrator shall be to:

Appoint and supervise the heads of all departments of the county except those elected by the people and except where the statutes provide that the appointment shall be made by elected officers; but the county administrator shall also appoint and supervise all department heads where the law provides that the appointment shall be made by a board or commission, by the chairperson of the county board or by the county board. Notwithstanding any statutory provision that a board or commission supervise the administration of a department, the department head shall supervise the administration of the department and the board or commission shall perform any advisory or policy-making function authorized by statue. Any appointment by the county administrator under this paragraph requires the confirmation of the county board unless the board, by ordinance, elects to waive confirmation or unless the appointment is made under a civil service system competitive examination procedure established under s. 59.52(8) or ch. 63. Any department head appointed by a county administrator under this paragraph may be removed at the pleasure of the county administrator unless the department head is appointed under a civil service system competitive examination procedure established under s. 59.52(8) or ch. 63.

WIS. STAT. § 59.18(2). Aside from this legislative grant of authority to appoint and supervise the non-elected heads of all departments generally, Wis. Stat. § 59.42, governing corporation counsel, specifically provides the county administrator with the exclusive authority to appoint and supervise corporation counsel. That section states:

- (a) Except as provided under par. (b), in counties not having a population of 500,000 or more, the board may employ a corporation counsel, and fix the salary of the corporation counsel. The corporation counsel appointed under this paragraph may be terminated at any time by a majority vote of all the members of the board.
- (b) In any county with a county executive or county administrator, the county executive or county administrator shall have the authority to appoint and supervise the corporation counsel if the board authorized the establishment of the office of corporation counsel. Such appointment shall be subject to confirmation of the board unless the board, by ordinance, elects to waive confirmation or unless the appointment is made under a civil service system competitive examination procedure established under s. 59.52(8) or ch. 63. The corporation counsel may be removed by the county executive or county administrator with the concurrence of the board unless the corporation counsel is appointed under such an examination procedure.

WIS. STAT. § 59.42(1)(a)-(b) (emphasis added). Thus, in counties that do not have a county executive or county administrator, the county board has the authority to appoint and supervise the corporation counsel. However, once a county has chosen to employ a county administrator, the statutes give the county administrator the exclusive authority to appoint and supervise the corporation counsel if the county board establishes the office of corporation counsel. OAG 01-10, 2010 WL 33675 (Wis.A.G.); See Karow v. Milwaukee Co. Civil Serv. Comm'n, 82 Wis.2d 565, 570, 263 N.W.2d 214 (1978) ("The general rule in interpreting statutory language is that "the word 'shall' is presumed mandatory when it appears in a statute.").

As the county board's organizational and administrative powers are limited by legislative acts granting specific powers to a county administrator, and the legislature has specifically granted the county administrator the power to appoint and supervise the corporation counsel, the county board would be acting outside of its authority if it, or a committee thereof, acted to appoint or supervise the corporation counsel. Further, because the statutory powers and duties conferred upon a county officer, such as the county administrator, cannot be narrowed or taken away by a county board, a county board in a county with a county administrator cannot reassign the county administrator's exclusive authority to appoint and supervise the corporation counsel. Consequently, in Dodge County, the County Administrator has the sole authority to appoint the corporation counsel, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors, and the sole authority to supervise the corporation counsel. This authority cannot be reassigned to the Executive Committee.

Employee's first day of employment as County Administrator is anticipated to be September 22, 2008 but may be modified by agreement of both parties. Employee agrees to serve as County Administrator in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, State Statutes, except as otherwise provided herein, and County ordinances and policies and to perform such other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the County Board of Supervisors and/or Executive Committee shall from time to time assign, including those duties and responsibilities set forth in the County Administrator position description.

Such duties shall include the supervision of Dodge County department heads, however it is specifically agreed between the County and Employee that Employee shall not be responsible for the oversight or supervision or administration of the Office of Corporation Counsel or the Corporation Counsel. This limitation extends to appointment, supervision and removal as specifically listed in Section 59.42(1)(b), Wisconsin Statutes. This limitation shall not limit Employee's authority to supervise the heads of all departments as otherwise listed in Section 59.18(2)(b), Wisconsin Statutes. The Dodge County Executive Committee and ultimately the Dodge County Board of Supervisors shall be responsible for the oversight and supervision and administration of the Office of Corporation Counsel and the Corporation Counsel.

Employee agrees that in engaging in disciplinary action involving a department head, Employee shall communicate with the County Board Chair and the Committee Chair or Vice-chair at their earliest opportunity." WHEREAS, the requested amendment has been set forth in writing in a document entitled Eighth Amendment To County Administrator Employment Agreement, Dated August 26, 2008, a copy of which has been attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee recommends that the Dodge County Board of supervisors approve the Eighth Amendment To County Administrator Employment Agreement, Dated August 26, 2008, and authorize and direct Russell Kottke, Chairman of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors, to execute the Eighth Amendment To County Administrator Employment Agreement, Dated August 26, 2008, on behalf of Dodge County;

RESOLUTION NO. 16-76

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS,

WHEREAS, on November 3, 1977, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 77-52, authorizing the Dodge County Social Services Board and the Dodge County Unified Board to enter into contracts with the State Department of Health and Social Services, as required, for the administration of the public assistance and human service programs of Dodge County, and to delegate the authority to execute such contracts to the Director of the Dodge County Department of Social Services and the Program Director of the Unified Services Department; and,

WHEREAS, on June 24, 1980, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 80-27, authorizing the Dodge County Social Services Board and the Dodge County Unified Board to execute contracts with various service providers for the provision of services to the benefit of their clients and authorizing said boards to delegate the authority to sign such contracts to the Director of the Dodge County Department of Social Services and the Program Director of the Unified Services Department; and,

WHEREAS, on August 21, 1990, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 90-40, which:

- 1. Created the Dodge County Department of Human Services; terminating the existence of the Dodge County Department of Social Services, the Dodge County Unified Services Department, the Dodge County Public Health Department, and the Dodge County Commission on Aging, and combining them into the Department of Human Services;
- 2. Created the Dodge County Human Services Board;
- 3. Terminated the existence of the Dodge County Social Services Committee, the Dodge County Unified Services Committee, and the Dodge County Commission on Aging and Public Health Committee; and,
- 4. Created a new position of Director of Human Services; and,

WHEREAS, on June 24, 1994, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 90-40, changing the name of the Dodge County Department of Human Services to the Dodge County Human Services and Health Department; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to provisions of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Dodge County Human Services and Health Department is required to enter into annual contracts with the State Department of Health Services, State Department of Children and Families, and the State Department of Corrections (together the "State Contracts"); and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 46.23(6m)(c), the Dodge County Human Services and Health Department contracts with numerous professional services and care providers to the benefit of its clients; and,

February 6, 2017

1. ARTICLE I – AGREEMENT/INTRODUCTION

Page 1. Rewrite as follows: "This agreement entered into effect the 1st day of January, 2016, by and between the County of Dodge, Wisconsin, hereinafter referred to as the "Employer" and the Dodge County Sheriff's Department Sworn Employees, Local 120 of the Labor Association of Wisconsin, hereinafter referred to as "Association". Remainder of the Article remains the same.

2. ARTICLE - RECOGNITION AND FAIR SHARE AGREEMENT

Page 1, Section 2.1. Rewrite as follows: "Dodge County recognizes that the Labor Association of Wisconsin has been selected by a majority of the unit to bargain with Dodge County on behalf of the Dodge County Sheriff's Department Sworn Employees and pursuant to provisions of Sections 111.70 and 111.77, Wisconsin Statutes, said Association is recognized as the exclusive bargaining representatives for said Employees with respect to wages, hours and conditions of employment."

3. ARTICLE II – RECOGNITION AND FAIR SHARE AGREEMENT

Page 1, Section 2.23. Rewrite as follows: "The Employer shall deduct from the first paycheck of each month an amount certified by the Treasurer of Local 120 as the uniform dues required of all Association members from the pay of each Employee in the bargaining unit. With respect to newly hired Employees, such deduction will commence in the month following the completion of the one (1) year probationary period.

During the probationary period, Employees may join the Association if they do choose and may have dues deducted from their checks by filing an authorization for payroll deduction with the Accounting Department."

4. ARTICLE II – RECOGNITION AND FAIR SHARE AGREEMENT

Page 2, Section 2.24. Rewrite as follows: "The aggregate amount so deducted, along with an itemized list of the Employees from whom such deductions were made, shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of Local 120 within ten (10) days of the date such deductions were made. Any changes in the amount to be deducted shall be certified to the Employer by the Treasurer of Local 120 at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such change."

5. ARTICLE VI – PROBATIONARY PERIOD

Article VI, Section 6.5 revise the following sentence: "An Employee who has been awarded a posted or management position shall serve a trial period of thirty (30) working days. During such trial period, either the Employer or the Employee may request that the Employee be returned to his former position." This sentence shall now state as follows: "An Employee who has been awarded a posted <u>bargaining unit</u> position shall serve a trial period of thirty (30) working days. During such trial period, either the Employer or the Employee may request that the Employee be returned to his former position."

6. ARTICLE VIII – INSURANCE AND RETIREMENT

Page 6-7, Section 8.1. Modify as housekeeping: "Health Insurance. Effective January 1, 2003, or as soon as possible thereafter, the County will switch carriers to the Wisconsin Public Employers' Group Health Insurance Plan. The County will pay eighty-nine and one-half percent (89.5%) of the premium rate of the lowest cost qualified plan in Dodge County for either single or family coverage."

7. ARTICLE VIII – INSURANCE AND RETIREMENT

Page 6, Section 8.2. Modify as follows: "The County will continue dental insurance with a maximum limit of \$1,000.00 per participant per calendar year; no deductibles; 100% payment of diagnostic, preventative, ancillary and regular restorative; 80% payment of oral surgery, endodontics, periodontics; and 50% payment of precious metal, prosthodontics and orthodontics with a separate \$1,000.00 lifetime maximum per participant. The County agrees to pay a flat payment that reflects the same amount paid by all eligible County employees.

8. ARTICLE VIII – INSURANCE AND RETIREMENT

Page 7, Section 8.5. Modify as follows: "Wisconsin Retirement Fund. Each eligible Employee, as determined by applicable law, shall be a participant of the Wisconsin Retirement Fund as provided by Wisconsin Statutes and rules established by the Wisconsin Retirement Fund Board. Employees hired on or after July 1, 2011 will be required to pay the same percentage of wages as "general employees" are required to pay. Effective January 1, 2017, Employees hired prior to July 1, 2011 will pay 4.5% of the employee contribution amount established by WRS, 5.0% effective January 1, 2018 and 5.5% effective January 1, 2019."

9. ARTICLE XI - SICK LEAVE

Page 9, Section 11.1. Revise language to reflect sick leave as being earned on the 15th day of the month to reflect treatment of all other eligible County employees.

10. ARTICLE XI - SICK LEAVE

Page 10, Section 11.51. Modify as follows: "The PEHP plan currently sunsets 12/31/2019. 11.51 This section of the agreement is put into place on a trial basis for the period of January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019. Inclusion of this language in a succeeding contract shall be treated as a completely new issue, which must be presented by one party or the other when proposals are exchanged if it is to be considered for inclusion in the next agreement.

During the term of the agreement regarding this section, January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019, Sections 11.4 and 11.5 above shall not pertain in any way to Employees who terminate employment and are eligible to retire from service, and only the provisions of this section shall define the disposition of accrued sick leave for those employees.

Employees who terminate employment with Dodge County between January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019, and who are eligible to receive a retirement annuity under the provisions of the Wisconsin State Retirement Plan, will have eighty percent (80%) of their accumulated sick leave (up to the contract maximum of 120 days) placed into a deposit account designated by the County, which shall be a post-employment health plan if available. The money in that account shall be restricted to the payment of insurance premiums. If the Employee dies prior to the depletion of the account, then the surviving spouse and/or dependents who are participating in the retiree's insurance plan must use the remaining monies in the account for insurance premiums. There can be no exceptions to this policy for persons eligible to retire during the term of this agreement or the tax-exempt status of any and all funds set aside in such deposit accounts will be negated. If the retired Employee and his or her eligible dependent(s) should die prior to the depletion of the account, the remaining monies in the account will be divided equally among other retirees who have monies in deposit accounts created under the provisions of this section."

11. ARTICLE XVI – UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

Page 16, Section 16.2. Rewrite as follows: "Each regular Employee shall receive an annual cash allowance for the purchase of uniforms in the amount of five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) to be paid on the first workday following January 1, 2017. Effective January 1, 2018, the annual cash allowance amount will be increased to six hundred dollars (\$600.00). Effective January 1, 2019, the annual cash allowance amount will be increased to six hundred fifty dollars (\$650.00).

12. ARTICLE XVI – UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

Create New Section 16.7 to read as follows: "If the Sheriff's Officechanges the full Class A or Class B uniform within five years of a full change, then the County shall provide employees with two hundred dollars (\$200.00) in additional uniform allowance for that year."

13. ARTICLE XXI – TERMINATION AND DURATION

Page 18, Section 21.1. Rewrite as follows: "This Agreement shall be effective as of the 1st day of January, 2017 and shall remain in force and effect through December 31, 2019and shall automatically renew itself from year to year unless either party notifies the other in writing on or before August 1, 2019 or August 1 of any subsequent year that it desires to alter or amend this Agreement.

This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect during negotiations unless either party shall give notice of termination as hereinafter provided."

14. CREATE NEW ARTICLE XXII – FACILITIES SECURITY OFFICERS

This Article is only applicable to Facilities Security Officers. Facilities Security Officers are Sheriff's Office employees in the Facilities Security Division who serve at the pleasure of the

EXHIBIT "A"

Chief Judge. These employees will accumulate seniority with respect to this position for paid hours determined based on the rate of 173.3 hours for each month seniority. Current employees of the Sworn Bargaining Unit within the Sheriff's Office will be made aware of any Facilities Security Officer open positions through posting of a notice of the vacancy, and will be given first consideration for such openings on the condition that they terminate their employment and be re-hired for the open position. There will be a one (1) year probationary period.

These employees will work flexible schedules determined by the Chief Judge, not to exceed forty (40) hours per week. Any hours worked in excess of eight hours per day will accumulate at straight rate into a bank of compensatory time. Employees will be responsible for using up compensatory time for hours not worked up to eight hours per day, and will not be allowed to carry over more than twenty-four (24) compensatory hours from one calendar year to the next without the approval of the Chief Judge. There will be no other method of payout of compensatory time.

Current law enforcement certification is a pre-requisite for this position. The County will provide for, and the employee is required to successfully participate in, minimum training as set forth by Wisconsin State Statutes. The employee will also be required to successfully participate in firearms training as determined by the Sheriff. Inability to satisfactorily participate in any training will be cause for termination of employment.

Employees in the Facilities Security Officer position will not be eligible for posting into any other position in the Sheriff's Office. Employees "transferring" into this position from another position will not be eligible for a sixty (60) day trial period.

Layoff and recall rights will exist specific to this position. Employees will not be allowed to bump into other Sheriff's Office positions, nor will other employees be allowed to bump into this position.

Employees are eligible for pro-rated uniform allowance in relation to regularly scheduled hours, payable on or before January 7 of the following year. Employees are eligible for a prorated amount as described in Section 16.7. Employees are not eligible for new-hire uniform allowance (16.3). The County will provide a gun, gun belt, walkie-talkie, and a badge for use by the Facilities Security Officers. This position does not require a vehicle assignment.

The wage for this position are identified in the wage appendix as Security Officer I and II. Employees regularly scheduled to work less than an average of twenty (20) hours per week over a one year period will not be entitled to benefits. Employees regularly scheduled to work an average of twenty (20) or more hours per week over a one year period may be eligible for the following benefits:

- Health insurance. Eligibility begins as of the first of the month following date of hire. (Current Sworn Bargaining Unit employees who "transfer" to this position, including by retirement, are considered to have continued eligibility with no interruption.) Employee contributes on a pro-rated basis determined by the number of hours worked in relation to full-time employment.
- Dental Insurance. Newly hired part-time employees, and "transferring" employees currently enrolled in the Dental Plan, who wish to participate in the Dental Plan may do

so by paying a pro-rated contribution amount. All coverage, etc., remains the same as for full-time employees.

- Wisconsin Retirement Fund. Employees are eligible for participation in the Wisconsin Retirement Fund based on eligibility requirements established by the Wisconsin Department of Employee Trust Funds. Current rules provide that an annuitant who wishes to return to work for an employer covered by the Fund can do so and may elect to participate again in the Fund if he/she exceeds his/her established earnings limit, but by doing so loses the current annuity payments.
- Life Insurance. Part-time employees may be eligible for the Life Insurance benefit based on participation in the Wisconsin Retirement Fund, with eligibility determinations made by the Department of Employee Trust Funds.
- Holidays. Part-time employees will be eligible for pro-rated Holiday pay, provided the employee works in the pay period in which the holiday falls. Pay for such holidays will be pro-rated based on the number of hours he/she is normally scheduled to work.

Facilities Security Officers are not eligible for vacation benefits, sick leave benefits, leaves of absence (except statutory leaves of absence), longevity pay, call-in pay, stand-by pay, or education benefits. No other benefits are implied by omission."

15. MOU – CIVIL SERVICE

The parties agree to the attached Memorandum of Understanding involving the application of Article 1, and Article 14 subsections 14.63, 14.64, and 14.71. As part of the MOU, the County reserves its right to file a declaratory ruling petition to determine whether language within Article 1, and Article 14 subsections 14.63, 14.64, and 14.71 involving the civil service requirements, ordinance and civil service commission constitute mandatory subjects of bargaining. The parties agree to follow the outcome of that final decision and to amend the collective bargaining agreement accordingly if the language is not found to constitute a mandatory subject of bargaining.

Dodge County Emergency Management received a check on October 3, 2016, from Wisconsin Emergency Management, in the amount of \$13, 614.42, which was a redistribution of the 2015 Emergency Management Planning Grant (EMPG) funds. Redistribution funds are unallocated EMPG funds the state receives and in turn redistributes, to eligible counties, in an attempt to bring the counties closer to the 50% of eligible salary and fringe expenditures. The 2016 budget reflects revenue and expense line items for redistribution funds. In the past, Dodge County has allowed Emergency Management to use redistribution funds to assist with additional projects, over and above the necessary plan of work requirements.

Recent events have made responders, nationwide, aware that there is a need to get life-saving care to injured victims quicker than customary response methods. Rescue Task Force (RTF) is the integration of law enforcement and EMS/Fire resources to provide life saving measures during an active killer or similar mass casualty event. After Action Reports (AAR's) help responders assess gaps in preparedness and response. Recent emergencies and exercise AAR's, in Dodge County, have identified the need for additional collaboration and training on Rescue Task Force and Search and Rescue techniques. To address the needs identified, Dodge County Emergency Management is currently working with local response agencies to host several full day training sessions. In order to host effective training sessions, which will train responders throughout Dodge County, there is a need to fund the costs of adjunction instructors, training props, hand-outs, preparedness kits, and consumables. Although committees are already working on both subjects, due to time and scheduling constraints, the training will not be completed in 2016.

On November 7, 2016, the Executive Committee supported and recommended approval of the request to allocate the entire balance of \$13,614 in redistribution funds and to carry-over the allocated funds into 2017, to BU 2811.5299 for the <u>specific purpose</u> of collaborating with and training local response agencies in RTF and Search and Rescue techniques.

I am writing in support of re-distributing and carrying over funds to the 2017 budget. The funds requested are for Emergency Management and will cover "search and rescue" training, as well as training for "rescue task force". Both of which are important to the safety of the citizens and first responders of Dodge County.

Over the years search and rescue has become very "technical". We've learned that the just gathering a bunch of people and sending them out looking for lost individuals is both unsafe and not very effective. Science and data is finding lost persons, and very effectively. We very much need to learn how to do this. The Neda Mine incident we had this year proves it can happen here. Those boys were found by trained expert mutual-aid personnel — we need to know what they know.

The "rescue task-force", or "RTF" for short, has evolved from lessons learned from active-shooter situations across the country. We've learned that people bleed to death waiting for SWAT to secure a building before sending in EMS. We've learned that the vast majority of shooters are lone wolves, are neutralized by the first law enforcement officer/s to arrive, or take their own lives when challenged by law enforcement. This creates a situation where trained law enforcement officers paired with trained EMS personnel can safely enter an area where the shooter has been neutralized or contained and treat and/or move injured persons to a safer area. I hate that we must plan for this type of situation. It is sad that this is our new normal. But we would be neglecting our duties if we didn't plan and train for it because it can happen here.

The Beaver Dam Fire Department has been very active with your Emergency Management staff in planning for the delivery of these programs to all of the first responders in the county. Our staff is trained and equipped to perform RTF and stand willing to help your EM staff where possible.

RE Sewer Pipe Replacement Project

Resolution number 16-94 is requesting to use project contingency dollars to install a different floor and wall covering in the kitchen at the Dodge County Detention Facility. The materials that were originally part of the specifications were a poured quartz flooring and FRP panels (commonly known as dairy board) for the wall coverings. Information regarding the proposed upgraded material was not known at the time of the adoption of Resolution 16-60.

Altro is the name of the product being proposed for the flooring and wall covering. Altro Stronghold 30 is a vinyl flooring material which has been around over 60 years. The slip resistance of this product is (R12 and Pendulum Test Values _>55 and is designed to minimize risks in wet and greasy conditions. This carries a 12 year manufactures warranty. The wall covering is an easy maintenance hygienic PVC surface which will help to ensure the kitchen is a more cleanable service than the concrete block. The wall covering is heat molded to go around corners and has heat sealed joints to prevent any moisture from getting behind the material. It is very strong and solid material that will outlast the FRP vinyl wall covering that was previous specified. I along with 4 others including Building Committee Chair Dennis Schmidt visited a site that has both products installed and was very impressed with both the floor and wall coverings. I believe this is a far superior and long term solution for the flooring and wall coverings in the Dodge County Detention Facility kitchen.

The old ceiling was install using steel grid which has caused them to rust making this a non-cleanable surface. New aluminum grid and ceiling tile will be install as part of the previous Resolution 16-60. While we are doing this it was determined to be in the best interest to the County to install LED light fixtures which should last between 15-20 years maintenance free. They will also use 40 to 70 watts per fixture less energy depending on how many bulbs are in each fixture. The current fixtures are 17 years old with LED's becoming the lighting of the future. The fixtures that are proposed to be installed are (32) 2x4 Acrylic LED Flat Panel, (14) 1X4 Acrylic LED Flat Panel, and (1) 4' LED Strip. There are Focus on Energy Dollars available for the LED fixtures which we will apply for.

RE: 2016 Budget Adjustment Resolution

Clearview estimates its revenue budget on the basis of historical and economic trends. Clearview also estimates revenues based on projected census, payer source, and reimbursement rate. With the expansion of Family Care and the effects of the Affordable Care Act, there has been significant changes in the coverage provided by all types of payer sources for the residents at Clearview. In response to these changes Clearview must adjust its revenue budgets for 2016 accordingly.

The Nursing Home saw budget shortfalls in Medicaid and Private Pay revenues whereas Medicare and Family Care revenues exceeded budget forecasts. The net increase in revenues is \$227,500.

Similarly the Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities facility saw lower Medicaid revenues but higher than expected Family Care revenues. The net decrease in revenues is \$122,800.

The Assisted Living areas of Clearview saw Family Care revenues lower than expected with Private Pay revenues higher. Dodge and Other County revenues were higher overall than what was expected. The net decrease in revenues is \$90,700.

The Behavioral Health area saw lower Dodge and Other County revenues but higher Private Pay and Family Care revenues. The net increase in revenues is \$228,500.

The Brain Injury Center saw substantially lower Medicaid revenue but was mostly offset by higher Family Care and Private Pay revenues. The net decrease in revenues is \$160,000.

Clearview also has a business unit that captures assorted facility wide revenues. This business unit saw a net decrease of revenues of \$75,000.

The overall amount of the budget adjustments for revenues show an increase of \$7,500. This will offset the requested increase in legal fee expenses of \$7,500. Legal fees have been higher than budget due to several cases that required outside legal counsel due to regulatory and collections issues that confronted Clearview.

RE: Resolution for use of sales tax to cover local police department maintenance costs for Spillman Technologies.

Honorable Supervisors of the Dodge County Board,

In November, 2015 the Dodge County Board unanimously approved the purchase of Spillman Technologies to replace our current troubled records management system. As part of that approval, an annual maintenance fee was included to be allocated from the Dodge County Sheriff's Office budget beginning in 2019. That annual maintenance fee is approximately \$130,000 per year. This annual maintenance fee is in line with previous fees for similar systems and had we continued with New World that annual maintenance fee would also be nearing that dollar amount.

As the system is intended to be a county-wide records management system, I presented it to 17 area law enforcement agencies throughout Dodge County with the desire to bring them on board with us. As part of bringing them on board, I require that those agencies pay to train their officers on the system this year. I also require that they pay a share of the annual maintenance fees beginning in 2019. The dollar amount which was calculated came out to \$280 per computer. In that calculation, the Dodge County Sheriff's Office took on the vast majority of the maintenance costs.

Currently, there are 15 of those 17 agencies who have signed on to the system which well exceeds the current collaboration in this area. Negotiations continue with the Village of Theresa and the City of Beaver Dam. As part of those negotiations, the City of Beaver Dam has requested that future maintenance beginning in 2019 be paid from Dodge County sales tax. These negotiations are ongoing. Officials have been advised that I do not have the authority to make that decision but that I would present their request to the Dodge County Board.

In drafting this resolution, I have worked closely with Supervisor Donna Maly, Supervisor Rebecca Glewen and County Administrator Jim Mielke in identifying the most reasonable approach to take in presenting this to the County Board.

As a result, we have made a decision to only bring the dollar amount needed to cover the varying police departments within Dodge County to you for consideration. That amount is \$19,400 and does not include any of the maintenance deemed as sheriff's office maintenance. Sales tax is not utilized to cover any other software maintenance plans from other county departments or offices and it is my intent to pay the sheriff's office share from our sheriff's office budget without sales tax support.

Furthermore, the dollars needed to pay the \$19,400 would not be allocated to any municipality directly, however, those dollars would simply be transferred to the sheriff's office budget to cover the costs those municipalities would otherwise be responsible for. The resolution is written in a manner which does not tie the hands of future county boards as the allocation from sales tax would need to occur every year during budget discussions. Should the County Board decide that sales tax dollars will no longer be allocated to Spillman maintenance, those costs will then revert back to those municipalities as contracted for payment.

I certainly appreciate varying opinions on this matter and I understand reservations of some supervisors in paying for this from sales tax. I bring this resolution to you out of a desire to accomplish our goal of having a county-wide records management system. I believe it is imperative that all agencies be part of this initiative so that we can all work together at keeping our community safe. It is my belief that while the county has been an excellent partner to its municipalities, this resolution will further that relationship and show that Dodge County is willing to work together with them in ensuring community safety.

Regardless of the decision by the Dodge County Board of Supervisors, I will continue negotiations in hopes of bringing all law enforcement agencies on board. It is my stance that these agencies who are utilizing a system purchased and maintained by Dodge County should have some financial responsibility to pay for the use of that system. The law enforcement agencies of Dodge County, by coming on board, will receive huge cost savings in the future. The savings will be found in an increase of efficiencies, a solution for the costly mandates by the FBI which these agencies must comply with by 2021 and the elimination of current software replacements and maintenance fees that they currently have in place. It is my opinion that these costs must either come from those municipalities directly or from county sales tax and not from the sheriff's office budget.

I thank you for your time and consideration of this resolution.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Spillman Contract, and a contract with the Dodge County Sheriff's Office, those 17 law enforcement agencies within Dodge County may utilize the records management system by paying certain fees, including an annual maintenance fee, beginning in 2019, which the Dodge County Sheriff has calculated to be \$280 per computer on which the software is installed; and,

WHEREAS, the Committees believe that, in the spirit of cooperation with local municipalities, it would be in the best interest of Dodge County to use county sales tax remittances to fully support those 17 law enforcement agencies who have contracted with the Sheriff for use of the records management system under the Spillman Contract, by paying their portion of the annual maintenance fee; and,

WHEREAS, it is reasonably anticipated that there will be sales and use tax receipts accounted for in Business Unit 1491, Taxes, Taxes Interest and Penalty, in the amount of \$29,400, available in budget year 2019 and thereafter, for transfer to Business Unit 2001, Sheriff Administration, Account No. 4921.03, Sales and Use Tax Fund, and sufficient to pay the annual maintenance fees for any law enforcement agencies which contract with the Sheriff for use of the records management system under the Spillman Contract; and,

WHEREAS, the Committees recommend to the Dodge County Board of Supervisors that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors:

Recommend to the Dodge County Administrator and to the Dodge County Finance Committee





ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE SPECIFICATION ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 7 OF THE DODGE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, SPECIFYING CERTAIN SEGMENTS OF DODGE COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAYS AS ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES.

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors has adopted on July 19, 2016, as Ordinance No. 955, a procedure for specifying designated segments of Dodge County Trunk Highways as All-Terrain Vehicle (ATVs) and Utility Terrain Vehicle(UTVs) routes (ATV routes); and,

WHEREAS, in compliance with that Ordinance, the Dodge County Highway Committee has received one or more requests for designation of certain segments of Dodge County Highways as ATV routes; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Highway Committee has reviewed the designation request(s), the report(s), and recommendation(s) of the Highway Department regarding such request(s), which included information regarding the topography, traffic patterns, uses, and other information which may bear on the safety and appropriateness of the proposed designation and any recommendations, including, but not limited to, reduced speed limits for ATVs and UTV within the segment, and time of day limitations; and,

WHEREAS, the sponsor of the designation has complied with the provision of Dodge County Ordinance No. 955, regarding contributing towards the cost of procurement, installation, and maintenance of signage on the ATV route segment; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Highway Committee recommends that the following segment(s) of Dodge County Trunk Highways be designated as ATV routes pursuant to Dodge County Ordinance No. 955, and the provisions of Section 23.33, Wis. Stats., as follows:

Dodge County Trunk Highway I from Prospect Road south to a point 290' north of the centerline of STH 33 (N6923 CTH I)—1.0 miles.

SO, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF DODGE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The following segment(s) of the Dodge County Trunk Highway system are designated as ATV routes:
 - A. Dodge County Trunk Highway I from Prospect Road south to a point 290' north of the centerline of STH 33 (N6923 CTH I)—1.0 miles.

These ATV routes shall have a 35 MPH speed limit unless posted speed limits are lower, then the lower speed limit shall apply and time of day limitations where no ATV/UTV operation shall be allowed between the hours of 11:59 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

3. Effective Date

This ordinance becomes effective upon passage by the County Board of Supervisors and publication and erection of required signs.
