# Dodge County Board of Supervisors October 17, 2017 – 7:00 p.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The October Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.
