Dodge County Board of Supervisors April 17, 2018 – 9:00 a.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The Organizational Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 9:00 a.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisor Roesch who had previously asked to be excused. Supervisor Wurtz left the meeting at 10:22 a.m.

Supervisors were sworn in by Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, and the Clerk read the Statement of Election. Chairman Kottke introduced and welcomed the new members to the Board: Kevin Burnett, William Hoekstra, Timothy Kemmel, Dale Macheel, Jeffrey Schmitt and Eugene Wurtz.

Chairman Kottke called for approval of the minutes. A motion was made by Supervisor Miller and seconded by Supervisor D. Schmidt to approve the minutes of the March 20, 2018, session of the County Board meeting as recorded, and dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

Communications on File

Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, reported there were no communications on file.

Special Orders of Business

Election

Chairman Kottke called for nominations for Chairman. Supervisor Miller nominated Supervisor Maly. Supervisor Nickel nominated Supervisor Kottke. Supervisor J. Schmitt nominated Supervisor Frohling. Supervisor Frohling declined the nomination. Chairman Kottke closed nominations and chose Supervisors Glewen, Justmann and Benter as ballot clerks. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor Maly - 8 and Supervisor Kottke - 24, thereby re-electing Supervisor Kottke as Chairman. Chairman Kottke thanked the Board for their support.

Chairman Kottke opened the nominations for 1st Vice Chairman. Supervisor Schaefer nominated Supervisor Frohling. Supervisor Hilbert nominated Supervisor Maly. Supervisor J. Schmitt nominated Supervisor Marsik. Supervisor Houchin nominated Supervisor Berres. Supervisor Marsik declined the nomination. Chairman Kottke closed nominations and chose the same ballot clerks. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor Frohling – 16, Supervisor Maly – 9 and Supervisor Berres – 7. None of the candidates received a majority of the votes and another vote needed to be cast. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor Frohling – 19, Supervisor Maly – 8 and Supervisor Berres - 5, thereby electing Supervisor Frohling as 1st Vice Chairman.

Chairman Kottke then opened nominations for 2^{nd} Vice Chairman. Supervisor D. Schmidt nominated Supervisor Marsik. Supervisor Sheahan-Malloy nominated Supervisor Berres. Supervisor Miller nominated Supervisor Maly. Supervisor J. Schmitt nominated Supervisor D. Schmidt. Supervisor D. Schmidt declined the nomination. Chairman Kottke closed nominations and chose the same ballot clerks. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor Marsik -16, Supervisor Berres -6 and Supervisor Maly -10. None of the

candidates received a majority of the votes and another vote needed to be cast. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor Marsik -17, Supervisor Berres -5 and Supervisor Maly 10, thereby electing Supervisor Marsik as 2^{nd} Vice Chairman.

Chairman Kottke then opened nominations for Four Members – At-Large to the Executive Committee. Supervisor Frohling nominated Supervisor D. Schmidt. Supervisor D. Schmidt nominated Supervisor Berres. Supervisor Houchin nominated Supervisor Sheahan-Malloy. Supervisor D. Schmidt nominated Supervisor Nickel. Supervisor Bobholz nominated Supervisor Maly. Supervisor Maly nominated Supervisor Miller. Supervisor Houchin nominated Supervisor J. Schmitt. Chairman Kottke closed nominations and chose the same ballot clerks. After the ballots were cast, the ballot clerks retired to tally the votes. At this time, the County Clerk informed the board members that she had put a voluntary demographics survey from the Wisconsin Counties Association on each of their desks. Question by Supervisor Berres regarding the survey answered by the County Clerk. The County Clerk was advised by the tally clerks that there was one ballot cast that was not signed on the back therefore reducing the number of ballots cast to 31 and the number of votes needed for a majority to 16. The votes were cast as follows: Supervisor D. Schmidt - 19, Supervisor Berres - 23, Supervisor Sheahan-Malloy - 16, Supervisor Nickel - 15, Supervisor Maly - 17, Supervisor Miller - 12 and Supervisor J. Schmitt - 11, thereby electing Supervisors D. Schmidt, Berres, Sheahan-Malloy and Maly to the Executive Committee.

Chairman Kottke called upon the Board to take formal action to select Annette Thompson, Dodgeland School District Superintendent, as a member of the UW-Extension Education Committee. A motion to select Annette Thompson as a member of the UW-Extension Education Committee was made by Supervisor Caine and seconded by Supervisor Behl. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointment.

Chairman Kottke called upon Supervisor Miller, Chairman, Judicial and Public Protection Committee who called on Sheriff Dale Schmidt who gave a presentation on the 2017 Sheriff's Office Annual Report.

The Chairman called for a 10 minute recess at 10:22 a.m.

The Board reconvened at 10:33 a.m., by order of the Chair. Chairman Kottke called for the following Resolutions and Reports to be read by the Clerk and acted upon by the Board:

Take formal action to adopt the County Board Rules as established by Resolution 17-102. A motion was made by Supervisor Frohling and seconded by Supervisor D. Schmidt. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the County Board Rules as established in Resolution 17-102.

A motion for adoption was made by Supervisor Berres and seconded by Supervisor Bobholz. Supervisor Miller made a motion to lay this Resolution over until the June County Board meeting. Questions by Supervisors Houchin and Maly answered by Supervisor Miller and Corporation Counsel Kimberly Nass. Comments by Supervisors Berres, J. Schmitt, Nickel, Maly and Frohling. The vote was cast with 12 ayes and 19 noes, thereby defeating the motion to layover the Resolution.

He also informed the Board that the Watertown Daily Times would like to get pictures of the Executive Committee and the new County Board members after the meeting.

At 11:15 a.m. Supervisor Frohling made a motion to recess until Wednesday, May 16, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Supervisor Maly seconded the motion. The motion passed by acclamation, with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

1 RESOLUTION NO. 18-04 2 3 **Authorization to Combine Payroll Groups** 4 5 TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, 6 7 WHEREAS, at present, Dodge County, an organization with approximately 950 employees, has 8 four payroll groups for its employees and elected officials with differing pay periods, pay dates and days 9 between pay period end and pay date; and, 10 WHEREAS, consideration was given to combining payroll groups prior to Dodge County's 11 implementation of Kronos Workforce Central, and it was determined at that time to delay combining 12 payroll groups; and, 13 14 15 WHEREAS, with the implementation of Tyler Munis Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP 16 project), another opportunity is presented to consider combining payroll groups; and, 17 18 WHEREAS, various Dodge County key personnel were tasked with evaluating the possibility of 19 combining all payroll groups into one so that all employees and elected officials will have the same pay 20 period and pay date; and, 21 WHEREAS, an evaluation, weighing benefits against risks, identified multiple benefits such as 22 23 standardization, efficiency, reduction in frequency of processes, reduction in errors, increased productivity, increased data access for budgeting and reporting and multiple risks such as impact on 24 25 scheduling, concerns regarding change, impact on employee personal banking and cost of programming 26 (Kronos); and, 27 WHEREAS, the Human Resources and Labor Negotiations Committee, the Information 28 29 Technology Committee and the Finance Committee (Committees) have been provided information regarding combining payroll groups; and, 30 31 WHEREAS, the Committees have also considered the impact on county employees, 32 implementation of the ERP project, and the need to engage Kronos for professional services; and, 33 34 35 WHEREAS, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors authorized the carryover of funds from the 2017 to the 2018 Information Technology Budget in Resolution No. 17-92 to fund the combining of 36 payroll groups to one payroll group; and, 37 38 WHEREAS, the Committees, having weighed the benefits and risks, have formed the considered 39 40 conclusion that Dodge County's four payroll groups should be combined into one pay group with a single pay period and pay date; and, 41 42 WHEREAS, the Committees recommend that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors authorize 43 and direct the combining of payroll groups; 44 45 SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendation of the Committees is 46 47 hereby adopted; and, 48

The committee finds that the proposal will not result in significant adverse impacts upon the surrounding properties or the natural environment and further finds that the land proposed for rezoning is suitable for development and will not cause unreasonable soil erosion or have an unreasonable adverse effect on rare or irreplaceable natural areas. The committee finds that the proposal will not significantly impair or limit current or future agricultural use of the adjacent properties. The committee finds that the proposal will not be used to legitimize or spot zone a nonconforming use or structure and finds that the rezoning is the minimum action necessary to accomplish the intent of the petition.

Ordinance No. 995

An ordinance amending the Land Use Code, Dodge County, Wisconsin by placing certain lands in Section 24, T13N, R16E, Town of Leroy, in the A-2 General Agricultural zoning district.

Whereas the subject matter of this ordinance has been duly referred to and considered by the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee and a public hearing having been held, after the giving of requisite notice of said hearing and a recommendation thereon having been reported to the Board of Supervisors. Dodge County, Wisconsin as required by Section 59.69 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Whereas the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee has reviewed and considered the facts presented in the application and received at the public hearing relating to the subject matter of this ordinance for compliance with the criteria listed in Section 2.3.4.I of the Dodge County Land Use Code.

Whereas the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee has found that the criteria listed in Section 2.3.4.1 of the Dodge County Land Use Code can be met for this proposal and has further found that the proposal is substantially consistent with the Dodge County Comprehensive and Farmland Preservation Plan and the stated purposes of the Dodge County Land Use Code. Furthermore, this Committee has found that the proposal will not result in significant adverse impacts upon the surrounding properties or the natural environment, that the land proposed for rezoning is suitable for development and will not have an unreasonable effect on rare or irreplaceable natural resources, that the proposal will not significantly impair or limit current or future agricultural use of the adjacent properties, be used to legitimize or spot zone a nonconforming use or structure and that the rezoning petition is the minimum action necessary to accomplish the intent of the petition.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Dodge do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The "official zoning map" adopted with the Land Use Code, Dodge County, Wisconsin on March 21, 2000 is hereby amended as shown on the map attached hereto and made part of this ordinance.


Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective upon passage.
