#### Dodge County Board of Supervisors November 13, 2018 – 9:00 a.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The November Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 9:00 a.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisor Bennett who had previously asked to be excused.

Chairman Kottke called for approval of the minutes. A motion was made by Supervisor Nickel and seconded by Supervisor Schraufnagel to approve the minutes of the October 23, 2018, session of the County Board meeting as recorded, and dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

#### **Communications on File**

Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, reported there were no communications on file.

#### **Special Orders of Business**

The Chairman called the First Special Order of Business: Affidavit of Publication – County Clerk Karen Gibson read the Affidavit of Publication for the Public Hearing.

Chairman Kottke asked County Administrator, James Mielke to come forward and present the budget. Mr. Mielke gave a power point presentation that summarized the 2019 Dodge County Budget. Mr. Mielke stated that the proposed tax levy is \$34,033,789 resulting in a mill rate of \$5.40 per \$1,000 of equalized assessed valuation, which is a \$0.10 cent decrease for the 2019 budget. Supervisor Fink made a motion to amend the 2019 Dodge County Budget by removing \$115,000 for Juneau Roof Replacement from 2019 Highway Budget (Decrease Expense), apply \$233,000 Highway Fund Balance (Increase Revenue) and include estimated GTA of \$2,782,501 in place of estimated GTA of \$3,129,645. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Caine. The vote was cast on Supervisor Fink's motion to amend with 30 ayes and 2 noes, thereby approving the motion to amend.

#### County Project and Issue Update Volume 47 December 2018

ERP Project: At the onset of the project, the "Go-Live" date was established as May 1, 2019. An adjustment has been made to the schedule, "Go-Live" is now scheduled for July 1, 2019. The adjustment is based on a December 3<sup>rd</sup> discussion with the project Steering Committee (Donna Maly, Julie Kolp and me); ERP Project Director Ross Winklbauer; Tyler Project Managers Lindsey Fulton and Erin Becker along with Government Finance Office Association consultant Rob Roque. The shared goal is to have a successful implementation. This is best accomplished with additional time invested now, versus short changing design, testing or training.

The adjustment will enable additional time for reviewing/modifying the Chart of Accounts; testing and training. The schedule adjustment has led to questions related to the project budget. The ERP Project was authorized by Resolution 17-21, adopted July 18, 2017. The total project cost is \$2,107,805 which includes a contingency of \$275,000. The adjusted Go-Live date will result in two additional months of the contractual Tyler Project Maintenance fee of \$4,700 per month.

Courts AV Project: The project design Programming Narrative is continuing to be refined. Meetings with the project team including Judges; Judicial Assistants, Information Technology; Physical Facilities; District Attorney; Corporation Counsel were held on November 16<sup>th</sup> and November 29<sup>th</sup>. The Programming narrative is nearing completion. Once completed, the project will transition to the development of Construction Documents which will lead to the bidding phase.

Monthly updates are provided to the Judicial & Public Projection and Information Technology Committees. At this time the project award remains April 16, 2019 followed by a completion date of December 1, 2019.

Central Services: John Veling, Director of Central Services has announced his retirement effective December 28, 2018. John began his career with Dodge County in December 1996. He has provided a consistent high level of customer service to all county departments. As of January 2<sup>nd</sup> there will be changes to mail pick-up / distribution and printing / copying impacting all county departments.

The Dodge County Finance Committee is the Committee of Jurisdiction for Central Services. The December 11<sup>th</sup> Committee agenda includes a tour of Central Services. The intent is to receive direction from the Committee regarding policy going forward and also direction regarding the status of the various equipment located in Central Services.

Currently, the Post Office does not sort or drop off mail to the following county locations: Administration Building; Henry Dodge Office Building; Detention Facility; Sheriff Office; Highway Office. The mail is picked up at the post office, brought to the Administration Building for sorting and distribution. An option under consideration (temporary) is to have the mail picked up at the post office, sorted at the Administration Building, with departments responsible for picking up their own mail after it is sorted versus distribution to the above listed county buildings.

Printing / Copying: Human Service & Health along with the Detention Facility are two high utilization areas of the county operations. Printing ranges from brochures, booklets, bound reports and forms. In the absence of Central Services, options are being explored as to how best to produce the necessary work product. Expenses related to an outside vendor will be the responsibility of the individual department(s). There is potential to have shipping / delivery expense associated with the finished product.

Holiday Schedule: County offices are closed December 24th & 25th and December 31st and January 1st.

#### **Gold Star Memorial Trail Opens To Public**

It took nearly five years and \$670,000 in donations and grants after the original trail concept was presented, but phase one of the Gold Star Memorial Trail (GSMT) is now open for hiking and biking, from Mayville's Theiler Park to the Horicon Marsh

Education and Visitor Center.

Despite cold weather forcing some delays in the final trail work, finishing louches were completed and barricades were removed around Thanksgiving, Nov. 22, signaling the opening of the trail.

"We are so very thankful to all those that contributed their time, resources and support to this unique community project – a project that provides a significant recreation, transportation and health resource while helping us remember and ap-

preciate those that gave the ultimate sacrifice serving our country and the families they left behind," said Bill Ehlenbeck, Dodge County Land Resources and Parks director and Gold Star Memorial Trail project manager.

The asphalt paved trail, mostly located within the right-of-way of Hwy 28 is approximately 2.1 miles long and available for non-motorized uses — hiking, biking, cross country skiing and snow shoeing. The trail will not be plowed in winter. Theiler Park will serve as the main trailhead where a kiosk with memorial, donor and trail information is planned along with installation of trail and trailhead identification signs in spring prior to its grand opening.

The grand opening for first phase of the GSMT is planned to be held on National Trails Day, Saturday, June 1, 2019. This event will provide a recognition of major donors and Gold Star families among other activities.

The ultimate concept of the Gold Star Memorial Trail is to connect the City of Mayville to the City of Beaver Dam through additional phases of the project. Currently, the Horicon Marsh Education and Visitor Center trails do not permit bike riding. However, walking a bike on the southern Bachhuber Trail through the Horicon Marsh will get

bikers to Palmatory Point, which then connects to the City of Horicon Gold Star Memorial Trail bike route. The Horicon bike route leads to the west end of the City near Whitty Park, which will serve as the connecting point for the next phase of the project from the City of Beaver Dam. The Horicon to Beaver Dam phase of the project is currently in the planning stages.

### ERP Project Schedule Update

The Financial Phase of the ERP Project initially scheduled for a May 1, 2019 implementation date has been adjusted. The new implementation date for Phase 1 Financials will be July 1, 2019. This decision was made after analyzing the schedule and reviewing with the ERP Project Steering Committee, Governmental Finance Officers Association (Rob), and Tyler Munis (Lindsey and Erin).

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF INCREASED FUNDING IN THE CHILDREN AND FAMILY AIDS ALLOCATION

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families provides funding to counties through the Children and Family Aids (CFA) allocation for the provision of child abuse and neglect services, including prevention, investigation, treatment, and out-of-home placement costs; and,

WHEREAS, base funding for statewide child welfare services has only increased once since the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families was created in 2009, by \$5 million in 2018; and,

WHEREAS, from 2013 to 2017, out-of-home care costs have increased 18% statewide, from \$81.4 million to \$95.7 million; and,

WHEREAS, county tax levy currently represents 63% of funding for child welfare services; however, counties are only required to match the CFA allocation at 9.89%, therefore, the county overmatch rate is currently exceeds 1600%; and,

WHEREAS, over the past few years, the child welfare workload has increased to unacceptable and unmanageable ratios in all counties across the state, resulting in a greater risk of negative outcomes for children and families; and,

WHEREAS, counties are struggling to recruit and retain child welfare workers due to these high caseload ratios, with increasing stress taking its toll and causing many experienced child welfare workers to leave the profession; and,

WHEREAS, the total number of child protective services (CPS) referrals statewide has increased by 43% since 2007 – from 55,895 CPS referrals in 2007 to 79,693 CPS referrals in 2017; and the total number of CPS referrals in Dodge County has increased by 37% since 2014 – from 526 CPS referrals in 2014 to 723 CPS referrals through September 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the total number of children in out-of-home care statewide has increased by 24% from 2012 through Q1 of 2018 – from 6,263 children in 2012 to 7,802 children by March 2018; and the total number of children in out-of-home care in Dodge County has increased by 60% since January 2014 – from 50 children in out-of-home care in January 2014 to 80 children in out-of-home care in August 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the total number of screened-in CPS reports statewide has increased by 9% since 2011 – from 18,706 screened-in CPS reports in 2011 to 27,226 screened-in CPS reports in 2017; and the total number of screened-in CPS reports in Dodge County has increased by 9% since 2012 – from 278 screened-in CPS reports in 2012 to 304 screened-in CPS reports in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the total percentage of children removed from their home statewide because of caretaker drug abuse has increased 119% since 2011; and the total percentage of children removed from their home in Dodge County because of caretaker drug abuse has increased 35% since 2014; and,

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WHEREAS, the total number of Children in Need of Protection and Services (CHIPS) petitions filed with the court statewide has increased 15% from 2008 to 2017; and the total number of CHIPS petitions filed with the court in Dodge County has increased by 62% since 2012 – from 47 CHIPS petitions filed with the court in 2012 to 76 CHIPS petitions filed with the court in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, a leading cause of these increases is the use of heroin, opiates, and methamphetamines by caretakers; and,

WHEREAS, it is critical that counties have the resources necessary to ensure the safety of children in all areas of the state; and,

WHEREAS, with the county tax levy caps, counties are struggling to identify resources to increase child welfare staff, especially given the significant overmatch counties already put into the human services system;

**SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors does hereby request that the state of Wisconsin, in its 2019-2021 state biennial budget, increase funding to counties in the Children and Family Aids allocation by the amount of \$30 million annually, to assist counties in serving the increasing number of children and families in the child welfare system; and,



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AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 7, SECTION 7.09 STOPPING, STANDING, OR PARKING OF VEHICLES, OF THE DODGE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES.

The people of the County of Dodge, represented by the Dodge County Board of Supervisors, do hereby ordain as follows:

- Section 1. Enabling Law. The Dodge County Board of Supervisors has the specific authority under Section 349.13, *Wisconsin Statutes*, to adopt this ordinance and limit the time of, or otherwise restrict, the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on highways over which it has jurisdiction, beyond the prohibitions, limitations, or restrictions imposed by Chapter 346, *Wisconsin Statutes*; and,
- Section 2. On November 15, 2018, the Dodge County Highway Committee recommended that a restriction of parking on the east side of a certain segment of County Trunk Highway S is necessary to promote safety; and,
- **Section 3.** Section 7.09(1) of the Code is hereby amended as follows:

\* \* \* \* \*

- 1. The provisions of §§ 346.50 346.55, *Wis. Stats.*, relating to the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles are hereby adopted as part of this section as if fully set forth herein. In addition, the Dodge County Board of Supervisors has declared that the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on the following county highways in Dodge County is subject to the following restrictions and limitations:
  - a. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on the east side of CTH T starting at a point 460 north of the centerline of STH 16/60 to a point 710 feet further north.
  - b. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on the west side of CTH T starting at a point 775 feet north of the centerline of STH 16/60 to a point 123 feet further north.
  - c. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on the east side of CTH I from Main Street to Taylor Street, Town of Portland, Dodge County.
  - d. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on CTH S from a point 500' east of the Wisconsin & Southern Railroad to a point 1,250' west in Sections 14 and 23, T. 11 N., R. 16 E., Town of Hubbard.
- **Section 4. Traffic Signs.** Pursuant to Section 7.03 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances, the County Highway Department shall place appropriate traffic signs on the above-described highway(s) on or before the effective date of this ordinance amendment.
- **Section 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon enactment by the Dodge County Board of Supervisors and publication.
- **Section 6.** Summary. An Ordinance amending Section 7.09(1) of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances pertaining to restricting parking on a portion of CTH S.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2.02 – STANDING COMMITTEES, BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; CHAPTER 19, PARKS AND RECREATION; AND REVISOR'S AMENDMENTS, OF THE DODGE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES.

The people of the County of Dodge, represented by the Dodge County Board of Supervisors, do hereby ordain as follows:

**Section 1.** Prior to the codification of previously adopted but not yet codified ordinance amendments, the Dodge County Departments evaluated the Dodge County Code of Ordinances to identify non-substantive edits.

**Section 2.** On December 4, 2018, the Dodge County Executive Committee considered the non-substantive edits submitted by Dodge County Departments and recommended amending Chapters 2 and 19 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances.

**Section 3:** Chapters 2 and 19 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances are hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 2 - THE GOVERNING BODY

2.02 - STANDING COMMITTEES, BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

(12) LAND INFORMATION COMMITTEE. (Am. #16-100) The Land Information Committee shall be comprised of 5 Board members. The 5 members shall be appointed by the Chairman and confirmed by the Board. In appointing members to this Committee, the County Board Chairman shall seek to represent the interests of the 5 departments using land records, namely the County Treasurer, Land Resources and Parks, Land and Water Conservation, Highway, and Sheriff. The Committee shall be responsible for land records modernization to promote and facilitate timely access to information, decisions based upon accurate information, and efficiency in government with the goal of establishment of an integrated, technologically sound, countywide land information system. The Committee shall act as an advisory and policy-making body for the Land Information Division of the Land Resources and Parks Department. The Committee shall also act as an advisory and policy-making body, to the extent permitted by law, for the Office of the Register of Deeds.

(14) PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT LAND RESOURCES AND PARKS COMMITTEE. The Planning, Development Land Resources and Parks Committee shall be comprised of 5 Board members. The 5 members shall be appointed by the Chairman and confirmed by the Board. The Committee shall be designated as the County Zoning Agency authorized to act in all matters pertaining to County planning and zoning under § 59.69(2)(a), Wis. Stats. In addition, The Committee shall be responsible for subdividing, sanitation, and economic development, land records modernization, and a countywide land information system. The Committee

Memo regarding Ordinance 1018 pertaining to the amendment to Section 7.08—Access Onto County Highways

The impetus for this amendment stems from the creation of the new Village of Kekoskee. The current highway access ordinance authorizes the Highway Department to control all aspects of accesses onto county highways <u>outside municipal boundaries</u> (not in cities and villages).

The village has multiple county highways within its new municipal boundary. Thus, it would now be the town's responsibility and authority to control access onto the county highways inside village limits. In review with the Village President, it was thought best for the Highway Department to continue to have authority on access inside the village limits on the high-speed county highways. We are best suited for this and have the experience and standards necessary to provide safe access points for both the property owner and all highway users.

This amendment would authorize the Highway Department to control access inside municipal boundaries on any county highway with a speed limit greater than 35 MPH. This requires two definitional changes and necessary wording changes.

In reviewing other county highways within municipal boundaries with a speed limit greater than 35 MPH, only one other instance apart from the Village of Kekoskee was found. It is CTH Y south of STH 49 which is in the Village of Brownsville and has a speed limit of 45 MPH. This area includes the Michels Construction yard operations on both sides of the road. There is little future development possibility in this area. If any did arise, a speed limit reduction may be considered (most likely to 35 MPH) thus eliminating our authority. Otherwise, the Highway Department would review and approve any new access.
