- Matt Peplinski with Farm Service Agency
 - o FSA fiscal year is the end of September. Anything after September 30th will be delayed.
 - Sign up for 2019 Dairy Margin Coverage Program closed September 27th. Sign up for 2020 begins
 October 7, 2019 with a deadline of December 13, 2019.
 - o Deadline for fall crop reporting is November 15, 2019.
 - o ARC/PLC program 2019 started September 3, 2019 with deadline of March 15, 2020. ARC/PLC 2020 start October 7, 2019 with a deadline of June 30, 2020.
 - Just completed a CRP continuous and CREP signup.
- Anthony Johnson with Natural Resource Conservation Service
 - o NRCS fiscal year is the end of September.
 - o Anthony reviewed some of the programs with NRCS.
 - Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP).
 - Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP).
 - Emergency Watershed Protection Program (EWPP) sign up ASAP.
 - Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) sign up ASAP.

Updates on 2019 Transect Survey

John explained to the committee what the Transect Survey was and how it was completed. He reviewed the results summary.

Update on Well Testing program

- John sent copies of the current proposed well testing program from UW Stevens Point to the Committee. He asked the committee to review the proposal and have any changes/suggestions to him by 10/2/19.
- The proposed well testing program is a 5 year commitment which can be extended.
- LWCD responsibilities would be locating information on the wells that would meet the qualifications for the testing program, educational meetings and sharing information. Possibly involvement from the Health Department to help with the promotion and education. John will contact them and get the proposed program to them and arrange a time to meet with them to discuss.
- Will need to increase the amount budgeted for well testing for 2020.
- The program will have to go to the November board meeting as a resolution.

Animal Waste Storage

- Have not heard from Adam Zimmerman since the last meeting.
- Have received an application from Heritage Swine.
- Clyman property has been sold. LWCD staff has visited the site. There are currently no animals on the property. The new owners has been contacted. They are aware of the issue with the existing manure pit. John will send the new owners the information that he has from the Engineer with the solutions to fix the current structure. The new owners will then have to decide what they will do. It was discussed that they will have 30 days to make a decision once they receive the information John sends them from the Engineer.
- Two permits were issued for new structures in Dodge County. One is a CAFO that is adding additional storage.

Farmland Preservation

- Software
 - o The program is progressing. Currently working on creating the reports that will need to be run.
- Notices of Non-Compliance

- John reviewed the form and the explanation for the new format.

Lake Sinissippi-Rock River 9-key Element Plan

- The plan has been approved. Copies were given to the committee members. It is also available on the Land and Water Conservation Webpage.
- An informational meeting will be held for landowners to go over the plan and answer any questions.

- Lake Sinissippi Bill Muche
 - Meeting was held September 10, 2019.

- Shoreline restoration: They will be watching the Lakes water flow and how the water released from the Dams effect the shoreline. The will be checking it in the spring and fall to see which is more damaging to the shoreline.
- Buoys will be removed from the Lake on October 15th.
- Boat launch project will get done by fall.
- Will be working with the waste water plant to improve better water quality.
- Lake was restocked with fish on September 21st.
- Anthony Island shoreline project completed.
- o Water monitoring has been completed. Last sample taken in August.
- Beaver Dam Lake William Foley
 - Officer elections were held on August 27, 2019.
 - Discussion was held regarding the Lakes water level.
 - Petitions were submitted to Dodge County for the formation of the Beaver Dam Lake District.
 Signature were counted and verified. Land Resources and Parks Committee has been assigned. A public hearing will be held on October 3, 2019 at 5:30 p.m.
 - o The Association has purchased a used pontoon boat to use for buoy removal from the Lake.
 - o The seed for Skunk Island had been received. They will be planting in October.
- Fox Lake Dale Macheel
 - Meeting was held on September 12, 2019.

- Charlie Nelson with Fox Lake Preservation Organization, Inc. update them on the cover crop seed program and the Charlie Hammer Slag project.
