8. BOARD ACTION

A. Review of Specialized Transportation Assistance program for Counties 82.21 and 5310 grants Board approved the Specialized Transportation Assistance grants 82.21 and 5310 which are used for transportation services and for transportation vehicles.

9. DIRECTORS REPORT-Ms. Bell

A. COVID19 discussion

Ms. Bell informed the Board that Human Services and Health Department is continuing to provide services via telehealth and is anticipating some kind of reduction in revenue due to not providing substance use group therapy and CCS services. Ms. Bell reported that other Counties are seeing the same situations. Human Services and Health Department staff are continuing to work remotely when possible. Our home delivered meal program continues to provide frozen meals and we have seen an increase in participation in this program. Ms. Bell also informed the Board that some staff members from Human Services and Health have been temporarily reassigned to Public Health to assist with interpreter services and contact tracing.

B. 2020 budget discussion

Ms. Bell reported to the Board that Human Services and Health Department is looking very closely at revenue reductions and expenditures in 2020. Vacant positions will be evaluated to make decisions about the timing of refilling these positions. There are no current plans to fill the vacant Foster Care Coordinator position.

C. 2021 budget discussion

Ms. Bell informed the Board there are a lot of uncertainties surrounding revenue sources and if there will be any reductions. Human Services and Health is also evaluating expenditures and looking at ways to continue to provide cost effective services for Dodge County residents.

Ms. Drays reported updates to the Board in regards to the Nutrition program during this time. Sheila reported that for April that the Dodge County Nutrition program provided 2789 frozen home delivered meals on a rotation by city basis. Nutrition also provides some shelf stable meal bags for someone new until they can be added to a rotation. Ms. Drays also talked about the food panty providing box meals and some of the Dodge County employees have volunteered to help box up some of these meals.

D. COVID19-Abby Sauer

Abby Sauer updated the Board on the number of cases in Dodge County as of May 6th, which was 44 cases, 9 being active, 23 have recovered and there have been 1144 negative test results. Ms. Sauer also reported that all 3 hospitals in Dodge County are testing patients and there are 51 labs in the state that processing the tests. Public Health staff follow up on all people that are tested and keep in contact with the people that test positive.

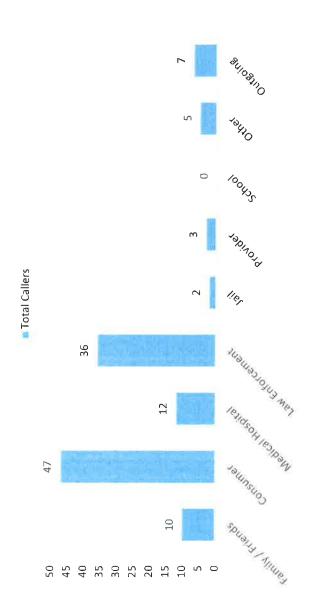

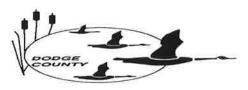
