3. Discussion: Development of Public Health Ordinances

Kim Nass from Corporation Counsel presented an outline of a new chapter in the Dodge County Code(Chapter 11 Health and Welfare Ordinance) that if approved would be an ordinance in place long term for the County. Ms. Nass explained that the importance of having this ordinance is to provide the Public Health Officer the ability to issue a public health order in the event of any of the following: preventing communicable diseases and spread, prevent public health nuisances and human health hazards, preventing food and waterborne illnesses and infections and spread and providing for the administration and enforcement of this Chapter and penalties for violations. A draft of the ordinance will be presented to the Executive Committee meeting on June 1<sup>st</sup>, then to the Human Services and Health Department meeting on June 3<sup>rd</sup> for review and possible approval from each Board and if it passes it could then go to the County Board for consideration. Ms. Nass also informed the Board that once this ordinance is in place it can always be changed, following the same process.

#### 6. DIRECTORS REPORT-Ms. Bell

A. COVID19 discussion

Ms. Bell informed the Board that Human Services and Health Department is still providing services via telehealth, but will be starting to gradually bring staff back in to the office starting June 8<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Bell also reported to the Board the numerous funding opportunities that are available such as \$185,241 from the CARES Act, \$52,439-Family First and up to \$60,151 for a Public Health emergency.

C. Update: NNAI MAT grant discussion

Ms. Bell talked to the Board about the \$20,250 grant that we received to work with the jail and she reported that Human Services will be applying again for the grant for the next cycle of July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Right now Human Services cannot go into the jail to meet with the inmates but there has been contact via telephone.


