Dodge County Board of Supervisors June 16, 2020 – 7:00 p.m. Administration Building - Juneau, Wisconsin

The June Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisor Miller who had previously asked to be excused. Supervisors Fink, Hedrick, Maly and Schraufnagel appeared via teleconference. Supervisor Fink arrived in person at 7:10 p.m.

Chairman Kottke called for approval of the minutes. A motion was made by Supervisor Nickel and seconded by Supervisor Benter to approve the minutes of the May 19, 2020, session of the County Board meeting as recorded, and dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, and was so ordered by the Chairman.

Communications on File

Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, read a letter dated June 11, 2020 from the City of Beaver Dam Attorney Maryann S. Schact regarding the Draft Ordinance Creating Subchapters I, II, and III of Chapter 11, Health and Welfare, Pertaining to Public Health and Amending Sec. 30.04, Penalty Provisions, e-mails dated June 11, 2020 from Douglas and Shawn Garczynski, June 12, 2020 from Jessica Kram, June 15, 2020 from Judy A. Stevens and June 16, 2020 from Harry and Sandy Vosekuil regarding the Chapter 11 Public Health Ordinance. The Chairman ordered these be placed on file.

Special Orders of Business

Chairman Kottke called the First Order of Business: Confirm Appointments made by County Administrator, James Mielke. Reappoint Jon Schoenike to the Board of Adjustment for a three year term, commencing on July 1, 2020 to July 1, 2023, both inclusive. A motion to accept the reappointment was made by Supervisor Behl and seconded by Supervisor Schaefer. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the reappointment.

Mr. Mielke then reappointed Marlene Adelmeyer, Patricia Kahlow and Carol Schulz to the Nutrition Advisory Council for three year terms, commencing on July 1, 2020 to July 1, 2023, both inclusive. A motion to accept the reappointments was made by Supervisor D. Schmidt and seconded by Supervisor Greshay. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the reappointments.

Mr. Mielke then appointed Kristen Mielke to fill a vacancy on the Library Planning Committee. Her term will expire on April 17, 2022. A motion to accept the appointment was made by Supervisor Caine and seconded by Supervisor Nickel. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointment.

The Chairman then called the Second Special Order of Business: Confirm Appointment made by County Board Chairman. Appoint Chairman Kottke to replace Becky Glewen on the Jefferson County Economic Development Consortium. A motion to accept the appointment was made by Supervisor Benter and seconded by Supervisor Caine. Question by Supervisor Maly answered by Chairman Kottke. The motion passed by acclamation with no negative votes cast, thereby approving the appointment.

Chairman Kottke called upon Supervisor Bobholz, Chairman, Human Services and Health Board who introduced Abby Sauer, Public Health Officer, Human Services and Health Department who gave an update on COVID-19 and Dodge County Public Health Officer Guidelines. Questions by Supervisors Greshay, Berres, Derr, Marsik, Sheahan-Malloy, J. Schmitt and Houchin answered by Abby Sauer, Public Health Officer.

Chairman Kottke referred this Resolution to the July, 2020 Executive Committee meeting for review. Supervisor Guckenberger made a motion to suspend Rule 14 to allow for action on the Resolution at this meeting. Corporation Counsel Kimberly Nass advised that this motion needs a second and needs to be voted on. The motion to suspend the rules was seconded by Supervisor Houchin. Questions by Supervisor Derr answered by Supervisor Guckenberger and Chairman Kotte. Comments by Supervisor Derr and Chairman Kottke. At this time Chairman Kottke reminded the supervisors that a motion to suspend the rules was not debatable. The vote was cast on Supervisor Guckenberger's motion to suspend the rules with 14 ayes and 18 noes, thereby defeating the motion to suspend.

The County Board of Supervisors discussed the draft Ordinance and Chairman Kottke stated that the Wisconsin Counties Association (WCA) formed a Public Health Committee and Chairman Kottke stated Dodge County would delay action, per Rule 14, on the Ordinance until the WCA Committee provides guidance.




Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective upon passage.
