The May 18, 2021 Meeting of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with exception of Supervisor Sheahan-Malloy who had previously asked to be excused.

Chairman Kottke called for approval of the minutes. A motion was made by Supervisor Maly and seconded by Supervisor Caine to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2021, session of the County Board meeting, as recorded. The motion carried by voice vote.

Communications on File

Karen J. Gibson, County Clerk, read a thank you note from the family of Naomi Kriewald and a resignation letter from Larry Schraufnagel, County Board Supervisor District 16, with an effective date of May 15, 2021. The Chairman ordered these be placed on file.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-12

Authorizing the Dodge County Communication System P25 Simulcast Upgrade

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN,

WHEREAS, Dodge County, by its Emergency Management Department, owns and operates nine (9) tower sites throughout the County from which public safety and other government radio communications are received and transmitted; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Sheriff’s Office utilizes one P25 encrypted radio channel and currently only one tower site transmits the encrypted Sheriff’s Office channel in simulcast mode; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to upgrade all tower sites to P25 encrypted simulcast technology by installing equipment that provides for a simulcast method of transmit/receive encrypted radio communications; and,

WHEREAS, in addition to upgrading the tower sites for simulcast, aging Quantar radio equipment will be replaced as a part of the upgrade; and,

WHEREAS, the 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Plan identified the P25 simulcast upgrade of the nine (9) tower sites in the amount of \$242,900 in Year 2021 of the Plan (hereafter “P25 Simulcast Upgrade”); and,

WHEREAS, the P25 Simulcast Upgrade will complete the simulcasting of all Dodge County radio channels across all nine (9) sites, improving the quality and reliability of Dodge County’s public safety communication system; and,

WHEREAS, Baycom Inc., 409 Felland Road, Suite 116, Madison, WI 53718, has submitted a proposal to Dodge County for the acquisition, FCC licensing/obtaining Letters of Concurrence, installation, configuration, and warranty of equipment necessary to upgrade the nine (9) tower sites, along with support and maintenance therefor, in the amount of \$242,680.42; and,

WHEREAS, copies of the proposal documents are on file in the Dodge County Emergency Management Office and may be reviewed during the Sheriff’s Office normal business hours; and,

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee recommends that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors approve the following:

1. Authorize proceeding with the P25 Simulcast Upgrade;
2. Accept the proposals from Baycom, Inc., and authorize entering into an agreement with Baycom, Inc. for the P25 Simulcast Upgrade; and,

WHEREAS, sufficient funds are available in the 2021 Dodge County Emergency Management Department Budget to proceed with the project;



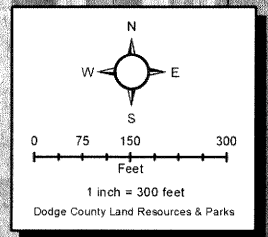

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE,
TOWN OR EMMET, DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN,

TO REZONE A 10 ACRE PARCEL FROM AN A-G GENERAL AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT
TO AN I INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT LOCATED IN PART OF THE E1/4 OF THE SE1/4 OF
THE SE1/4 IN SECTION 5. AMEND THE TOWN OF EMMET ZONING ORDINANCE
TO ALLOW FOR A RECYCLING SERVICE AS A CONDITIONAL USE IN
THE INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT. (SEE ATTACHED MAP and ADDENDEM)

We, the Dodge County Land Resources and Parks Committee, hereby report favorably on the petition of GAK Enterprises LLC requesting amendment of the Land Use Code, Dodge County, Wisconsin, to rezone approximately 3.9-acres of land from an R-1 Single Family Residential Zoning District to a C-2 Extensive Commercial Zoning District in the SE ¼, of the NE ¼, Section 12, Town of Calamus, to allow for the establishment of a multi-use commercial facility at this location including professional offices, a rental or recreational hall and for the sale of landscaping/construction materials from this site including bark and decorative stone and recommend adoption of the attached ordinance.

The committee has reviewed and considered the facts presented in the application and received at the public hearing and finds that the criteria listed in Section 2.3.4.1 of the Dodge County Land Use Code can be met for this proposal. 
The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Dodge does ordain as follows:

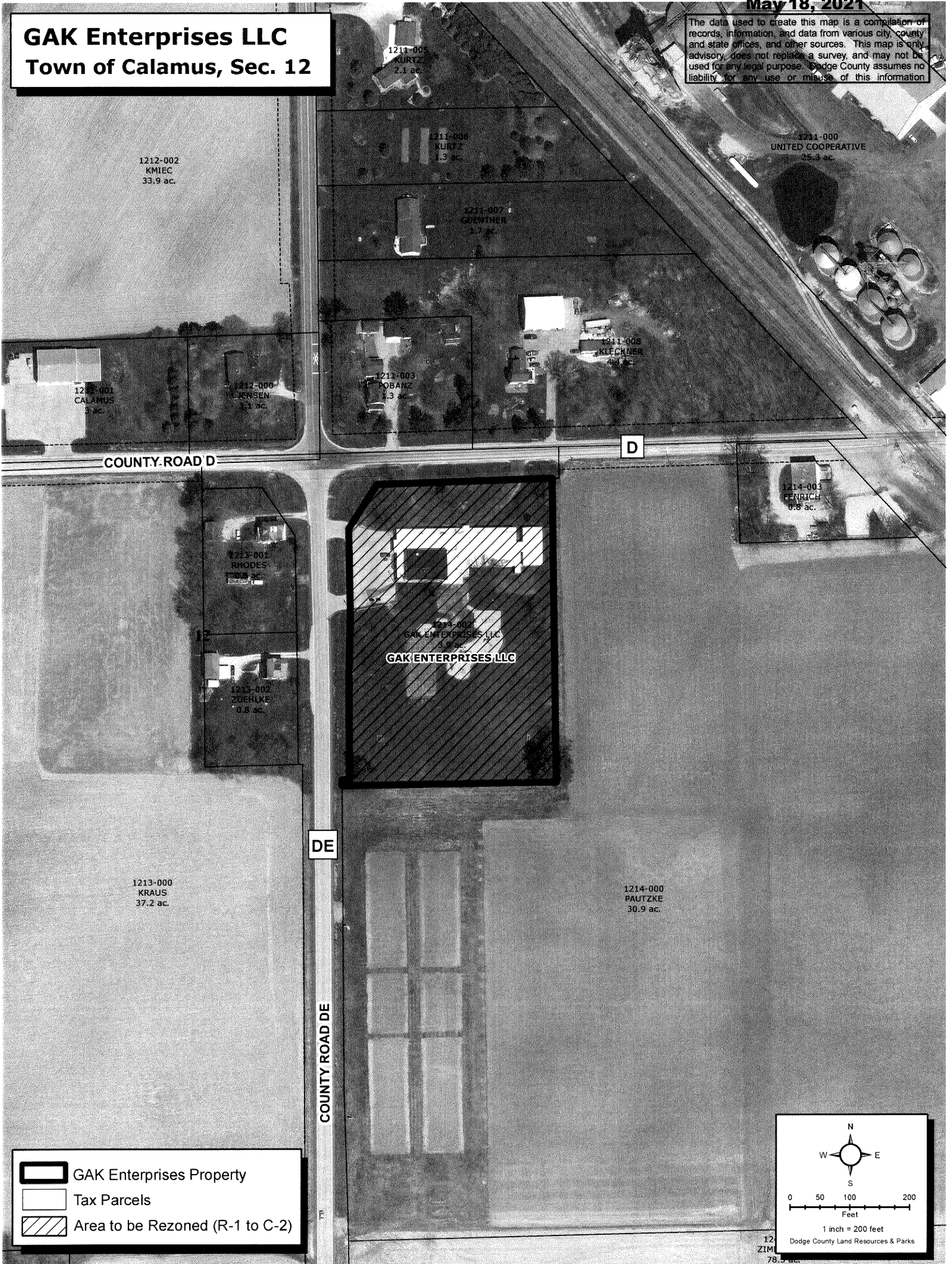
