Reports from Visiting Legislative Officials

Senator Ballweg gave a very detailed report on the on-going state budget discussions. Senator Ballweg reported that there seems to be acceptance by both parties.

Update of County Issues WCA

Kyle Christianson reported he thought the budget was a good budget for counties. He reported on Federal funds coming to counties. Also reported on redistricting issues. The discussion on Opioids continues, the settlement will give 70% to counties and 30% to state. He reminded members of the up-coming WCA conference being held in LaCrosse in September.

Program: Dan Fedderly, Exec. Director Wisconsin County Highway Association

Mr. Fedderly reported on General Transportation Aids and other programs that will be coming. This includes bridge projects. He also reported on Legislative efforts by WCHA including Work Zone Safety. There are three pieces to this legislation: 1) Requiring Drivers Ed programs include work zone safety training. 2) Allowing for green florescent lighting for Highway vehicles to get drivers attention. 3) Flaggers will be allowed to report drivers. They would be able to wear body cameras or use dash cameras for review by law enforcement.

Open Discussion of County Issues

Discussion included Covid-19, budgets and anticipation of federal funding. Next meeting in Sauk County.
