The meeting was called to order by Ed Benter, Vice Chairman, at 4:00 p.m.

Approve Minutes of the May 17, 2022, meeting of the Taxation Committee: A motion was made by Nancy Kavazanjian and seconded by Dennis Schmidt to approve the May 17, 2022, minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Public Comment: None

Report on Status of 2022 In Rem No. 1 List of Unredeemed Parcels: Corporation Counsel Kim Nass reported on the 2022 In Rem No. 1 list of unredeemed parcels. Nass reported that all of the properties on the 2022 In Rem No. 1 list have been conveyed and none are outstanding.

Review, discuss, and take action on unredeemed, unsold In Rem properties, pending In Rem actions or tax delinquent properties from prior years: Kim Nass reported on a parcel of real estate located at 270 E. Kindt Street, City of Juneau, Wisconsin, and owned by Jenifer Linendoll, (PIN 241-1115-2723-008). The Committee heard options for transfer of this property to Wes Mulkey. Kim Nass explained that the Taxation Committee could proceed *In Rem* and once the property was acquired by the County, either deed it to the City of Juneau or advertise it for bid. The City has made it clear that it has no interest in taking ownership of the property. The Committee heard comments from Mr. Mulkey. The Committee indicated that it was not interested in proceeding *In Rem* at this time. The Committee requested Kim Nass to contact the City of Juneau to determine the amount of taxes it would be willing to repay. The Committee asked that Kim Nass report the status at the next meeting.

Kim Nass reported on other unredeemed, unsold In Rem properties in Dodge County, pending In Rem actions or tax delinquent properties. Nass reported that there are no properties to discuss.

Kim Nass reported on CMC Heartland Partners (PIN 020-1117-3132-016), County Road WS, Woodland, WI. Kim Nass reported that the Town of Herman has an interested party who is willing to acquire the property from the Town of Herman after the County forecloses. The Town of Herman is working on an agreement with the interested party. The Committee asked that the Town of Herman and the interested party work out arrangements first before the County proceeds to take the parcel. Kim Nass will follow up with the Town of Herman to determine the status.

Authorize Dodge County to Become a Member of the Wisconsin PACE Commission

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0301, two or more municipalities of the State of Wisconsin, may by contract create a commission for the joint exercise of any power or duty required or authorized by law; and,

 WHEREAS, Dodge County is a "municipality" as that term is defined in Wis. Stat. § 66.0301 and a political subdivision located in the State; and,

WHEREAS, Dodge County is empowered by law to promote economic, cultural and community development, including, without limitation, the promotion of opportunities for the creation or retention of employment, the stimulation of economic activity, the increase of the tax base, and the promotion of opportunities for education, cultural improvement and public health, safety and general welfare, which may be accomplished by various means; and,

 WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 66.0627(8) authorizes a county in this State to, among other things, participate in or facilitate the financing of an energy improvement, a water efficiency improvement or a renewable resource application to a real property within its jurisdiction and to provide for such financing through the imposition of a special charge against the property benefitted by the energy or water efficiency improvement or renewable resource project; and,

WHEREAS, such financings are commonly referred to as "Property Assessed Clean Energy" or "PACE" financings; and,

WHEREAS, Dodge County has determined that it is in the public interest to provide real property owners, lessees, lenders and other transaction parties in Dodge County with access to a uniformly-administered program for PACE financing; and,

WHEREAS, in 2016, several Wisconsin counties, with the support of the Wisconsin Counties Association, League of Wisconsin Municipalities, Green Tier Legacy Communities and other stakeholders created a commission pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0301 to be known as the Wisconsin PACE Commission ("Commission"); and,

WHEREAS, the Commission was created and operates in accordance with a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement Relating to Wisconsin PACE Commission ("Commission Agreement") which is on file in the Dodge County Clerk's Office; and,

WHEREAS, it is in Dodge County's best interests to join the Wisconsin PACE Commission and authorize the execution of the Commission Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 and the provisions of the Commission Agreement, Dodge County must adopt an Ordinance relating to the administration of PACE financings in Dodge County ("PACE Ordinance"); and,

entering into the Commission Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Resolution to authorize Dodge County to become a member of the Commission and authorize a duly-appointed representative of Dodge County to finalize and execute the final Commission Agreement:

WHEREAS, adoption of the PACE Ordinance is a necessary condition to Dodge County

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes Dodge County's membership in the Wisconsin PACE Commission, and authorizes and directs the Dodge County Board Chair to sign the Commission Agreement upon receipt of the final form of the Commission Agreement, subject to the review and approval of the Dodge County Corporation Counsel; and.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to make an appointment of a county board supervisor or other county official to act as Dodge County's official representative in the PACE Commission and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The March Session of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Russell Kottke at 7:00 p.m.

The Board rose to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken by the Clerk with all Supervisors being in attendance with the exception of Supervisors Hilbert, Kemmel and Nickel who had previously asked to be excused. Supervisor J. Schmitt arrived at 7:19 p.m.

Chairman Kottke called for approval of the minutes. The Chairman called the First Special Order of Business: Confirm Appointment made by County Board Chairman. Reappoint Lynn Schaal as a member of the Board of Directors on the Friends of Clearview Committee for a two year term, commencing on March 21, 2019 to March 21, 2021, both inclusive.
