

RESOLUTION NO.	_13-45
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A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 418 AND ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 2 TO 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 418, TO ALTER THE RECOUNT FEE SCHEDULE

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS.

WHEREAS, current Wisconsin Law provides that any candidate who receives votes in an election and any elector who votes in a referendum may petition for a recount of the votes cast; and.

WHEREAS, current recount fees do little to offset actual recount costs; and,

WHEREAS, 2013 Assembly Bill 418 and Assembly Amendment 2 to 2013 Assembly Bill 418 propose to:

1. Amend Section 9.01(1)(ag)1., of the Wisconsin Statutes, to read as follows:

"(ag)1. If the difference between the votes cast for the leading candidate and those cast for the petitioner or the difference between the affirmative and negative votes cast upon any referendum question is less than 10 if 1,000 or less votes are cast or not more than 0.5% 0.25 percent of the total votes cast for the office or on the question if more than 1,000 votes are cast following canvassing of all valid provisional and absentee ballots, the petitioner is not required to pay a fee." and,

2. Amend Section 9.01(1)(ag)1m., of the Wisconsin Statutes, to read as follows:

"Im. If the difference between the votes cast for the leading candidate and those cast for the petitioner or the difference between the affirmative and negative votes cast upon any referendum question is at least 10 if 1,000 or less fewer votes are cast or is more than 0.5% 0.25 percent but not more than 2% 1 percent if more than 1,000 votes are cast following canvassing of all valid provisional and absentee ballots, the petitioner shall pay a fee of \$5 \$25 for each ward for which the petition requests a ballot recount, or \$5 \$25 for each municipality for which the petition requests a recount where no wards exist." and.

- 3. Amend Section 9.01(1)(ag)2., of the Wisconsin Statutes, to read as follows:
 - "2. If the difference between the votes cast for the leading candidate and those cast for the petitioner or the difference between the affirmative and negative votes cast upon any referendum question is more than 2% 1

<u>percent</u> if more than 1,000 votes are cast following canvassing of all valid provisional and absentee ballots, the petitioner shall pay a fee equal to the actual cost of performing the recount in each ward for which the petition requests a recount, or in each municipality for which the petition request a recount where no wards exist.";

RESOLUTION NO13-46

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 429 TO ALTER REQUIREMENTS FOR MARRIAGE OFFICIANTS

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DODGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN MEMBERS.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 765.16, of the *Wisconsin Statutes*, the following persons are authorized to officiate at a marriage in Wisconsin: 1) an ordained member of the clergy; 2) a licentiate of a denominational body or an appointee of a bishop serving as the regular member of the clergy of any church of the denomination to which the member of the clergy belongs; 3) the parties themselves, by mutual declaration that they take each other as husband and wife; 4) a judge, reserve judge, or a municipal judge; and, 5) a circuit court commissioner; and,

WHEREAS, Section 765.17, of the *Wisconsin Statutes*, requires an out-of-state member of the clergy or an out-of-state licentiate who officiates at a marriage in Wisconsin to possess a "letter of sponsorship" from a Wisconsin member of the clergy of the same religious denomination; and,

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the above-listed statutory requirements, in 2005 the Wisconsin Attorney General opined that neither the State of Wisconsin nor the Clerk of a Wisconsin county is lawfully authorized to inquire about the method of ordination of either a member of the clergy or a licentiate, or require an officiant to show his or her credentials; and,

WHEREAS, "ordination certificates" have become widely available via the Internet to individuals who pay a small fee, regardless of whether or not the individuals have attained the age of 18 years, and regardless of whether or not the individuals have completed any religious education; and,

WHEREAS, the deregulation of marriage officiants, combined with the ease of becoming ordained via the Internet, has created a situation in which practically anyone can easily become lawfully authorized to officiate at a marriage in Wisconsin, including, presumably, individuals who have not attained the age of 18 years; and,

WHEREAS, 2013 Assembly Bill 429: 1) requires that marriage officiants be at least 18 years of age; and, 2) eliminates the "letter of sponsorship" requirement for out-of-state officiants, as a result of the fact that credentials are not required of in-state members of the clergy, in-state licentiates, or unaffiliated officiants;

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors hereby supports legislation to alter the requirements for marriage officiants as set forth in 2013 Assembly Bill 429; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and all Wisconsin State Legislators with a constituency within Dodge County.
