Drainage Board Proposal to Borrow Money

The Dodge County Drainage Board is composed of 3 members appointed by the Circuit Court under Chapter 88, Wisconsin statutes. The Board has the duty to help organize, construct, and maintain Drainage Districts organized under Chapter 88. The Board is authorized to contract with engineering services, legal services and construction firms and is authorized to borrow money on behalf of Drainage Districts.

Dodge County has 25 active Districts. Number 88 ,located in Burnett Township has been constructed in 3 phases, of which the first 2 have been paid for by assessments against the benefited acres of the land owners in the District 88.

In order to prevent the excess burden of a second assessment in one calendar year, the Board proposes to borrow on behalf of the members to complete payment to the contractors when there work has been completed. We expect that to occour within another month.

Our Proposal:

That the Dodge County Finance Committee loan to the Committee for District #88 the amount of \$150,000.

That the period of the loan be no more than 9 months.

That the interest rate be negotiated.

That the Drainage board will make an assessment against the benefited acres to repay all principal and accrued interest to be due no later than 9 months after the loan has been made.

Note: This is not setting precedent. The board borrowed money from the County while Mr. Roger Gorst was auditor.

The Board is willing to meet with Finance Committee to answer any questions and discuss the proposal.

- 3. The Board is authorized to contract for the provision of engineering services, legal services, and construction services, and is authorized to borrow money on behalf of Drainage Districts;
- 4. Dodge County has 25 active Drainage Districts;
- 5. District No. 88, located in the Town of Burnett, Dodge County, Wisconsin, has been constructed in three phases, of which the first two have been paid for by assessments against the benefited acres of the landowners in District No. 88;
- 6. In order to prevent the excess burden of a second assessment in one calendar year, the Board has proposed to borrow \$150,000 from Dodge County, and to use the loan proceeds to complete payment to the contractors after the contractors have completed the work; and,
- 7. The Drainage Board will make an assessment against the benefited acres to repay Dodge County all principal and accrued interest by not later than April 1, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the Dodge County Finance Committee has considered the request of the Dodge County Drainage Board and recommends that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors authorize Dodge County to make an unsecured loan to the Dodge County Drainage Board in the amount of \$150,000, for a period of time commencing on the date that the Drainage Board will make a Promissory Note and ending on April 1, 2015, both inclusive, at an interest rate of three and one-half per cent (3.5%) per annum, which unsecured loan shall be evidenced by a Promissory Note to be made by the Dodge County Drainage Board, and that funds for this loan shall be taken from Business Unit 100.3429, Unassigned General Fund;

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs the Dodge County Finance Director to make an unsecured loan to the Dodge County Drainage Board in the amount of \$150,000, for a period of time commencing on the date that the Drainage Board will make a Promissory Note and ending on April 1, 2015, both inclusive, at an interest rate of three and one-half per cent (3.5%) per annum, which unsecured loan shall be evidenced by a Promissory Note to be made by the Dodge County Drainage Board, and that funds for this loan shall be taken from Business Unit 100.3429, Unassigned General Fund.

REPORT 1

TO THE HONORABLE DODGE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

We, the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee, hereby report unfavorably on the petition of Ronald and Kristina Seeber requesting amendment of the Land Use Code, Dodge County, Wisconsin, to rezone approximately 6-acres of land from an A-1 Prime Agricultural Zoning District to an A-2 General Agricultural Zoning District in part of the SE ¼, SW ¼, Section 30, Town of Calamus, for the purpose of establishing a salvage and junk yard and trucking business on this site and recommend denial of the proposed amendment.

The committee has reviewed and considered the facts presented in the application and received at the public hearing and finds that the criteria listed in Section 2.3.4.I of the Dodge County Land Use Code can not be met for this proposal. The Committee finds that the proposal may result in significant adverse impacts upon the surrounding properties and the natural environment and further finds that the land proposed for rezoning is not suitable for the type of development that is allowed within the A-2 General Agricultural Zoning District. The Committee also finds that the Town Board of the Town of Calamus has submitted a resolution to deny the rezoning request.

Therefore, in accord with Section 2.3.4.E of the Code, the Committee has filed a resolution effectuating its recommendation to deny the petition with the Committee's reasons for denial.

Whereas the Dodge County Planning, Development and Parks Committee has made the finding that the criteria listed in Section 2.3.4.I of the Dodge County Land Use Code cannot be met for this rezoning petition that is the subject matter of this Resolution and therefore has reported unfavorably on this petition.

So, now, therefore, be it resolved that the Dodge County Board of Supervisors hereby denies the petition to amend the Land Use Code, Dodge County Wisconsin as represented by "Exhibit A" attached to and made a part of this Resolution.
